DB's Dabblings: "Our Youth and Family Ministry Discussion "

As I mentioned last week, we are discussing Youth and Family Ministry each week in the GPS Class ("Godly Parenting Skills"). The Elders have asked me to preach on the topic in our Sunday morning worship because some who want to, and need to, engage in this discussion are not able to be in the GPS class. We also want to bring the whole church family into this discussion, which would include many members who would not normally think of themselves as having anything to contribute to this discussion. So, for the next few weeks I will be preaching on some principles of building an "intergenerational" Youth and Family Ministry and the characteristics of the minister we need to lead such a ministry, and we will follow up on those lessons in the GPS class.

Last week in class the participants contributed these 10 important expectations they would have for a Youth Minister (someone who works with teenagers).

10 Expectations of the Youth Minister given by the GPS Class

- 1. Building personable relationships with Teens and involved in their activities.
- 2. Plan activities to grow greater bonds with one another and other groups.
- 3. Able to function successfully in the tech world.
- 4. Develop and teach Biblical lessons that are relevant to Teens.
- 5. Have a contagious heart for Jesus.
- 6. Build faith leaders.
- 7. Be a person of character (high moral standards, integrity, trustworthy, etc.)
- 8. Stable, consistent, resilient, dependable.
- 9. Team player that leads and builds teamwork.
- 10. Fits in well into our church and community.

In addition to any discussion that comes as a follow-up to the sermon from last week, we will continue to discuss these 10 Expectations asking some of these questions: If you were to rank these based on their importance to you and your child, which ones would be at the top of the list? Why do they have that level of importance to you? How does it help you to know why other parents see other items on the list as more important than the ones you listed as most important? 

Graham Street Church of Christ is organizing a **Mission Trip to Bowling Green, KY** to help with Tornado Relief and Rebuilding. The trip is **March 5th-11th** and will cost \$75 per person (\$50 for children 12 and under). This rate will cover lodging, meals (excluding travel days), and will help cover a portion of the building materials and other supplies. February 20th is the last day to sign up.

All ages are welcome, but students in 8th grade and below are required to have an accompanying adult sponsor that is willing to take responsibility for the student while on the trip.

Our group will likely assist in 2 specific ways:

1.) **Neighborhood Rebuilding Projects:** could be jobs such as roofing, framing, hanging dry-wall, etc.

2.) Volunteering at the Bowling Green Disaster Resource Center Storefront: sorting and stocking supplies, checking "shoppers" in, helping "shoppers" get what they need, etc.

In addition, we will be staying at <u>Big Reedy Christian Camp</u> (just north of Bowling Green), and will need some volunteers to stay at camp each day to help prepare and cook meals, provide childcare for some of the younger children, etc.




