Scripture for today: Jeremiah 17:5-8 + 1 Corinthians 15:12-20 + Luke 6:17-26
Our theme today focuses on the family of believers – God's family. Pastor Hanft is our preacher.

- ** IN THE 8:00 SERVICE TODAY Celebration Choir will be offering a number of choral pieces to add to our worship. The ending of preservice will be a hymn based on the Gospel lesson for today from Luke 6, the Beatitudes "Blest Are They." The choir will chant the appointed Psalm for today, Psalm 1, with the congregation joining in on the 'Gloria Patri' for this selection. At the close of the service, the choir will sing "Family of Faith". The last stanza will appear on the screens and the congregation is invited to join the choir in singing. This selection recognizes we are all unique individuals, but yet calls us to be one in our family of faith.

Mission Memo ... Pray for Church Workers Around the World & in our Community

Rev. Dr. Walter and Robyn Steele are missionaries in Africa. Rev. Steele tells about a student Abraham Thiong' who he taught in the Bachelor of Theology Program at Neema Lutheran College, Matongo, Kenya. Recently, Pastor Abraham Thiong' conducted youth training in the Small Catechism, the Lutheran Confessions, and basic Christian Doctrine because Abraham wants to equip these young people so they might be strong in the faith and be ready to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with those they meet. He knows that getting the message correct and getting the message out are both very important. Over 35 young men and several women attended the two session training. Abraham shared Jesus redemption for them and explained their new birth of water and the Spirit by their Baptism into Christ, which is counter to the core teaching of the various African Traditional Religions. Pray that God grants Walter wisdom and strength as he works alongside the Principal and other faculty to increase the quality of teaching at Matongo.
