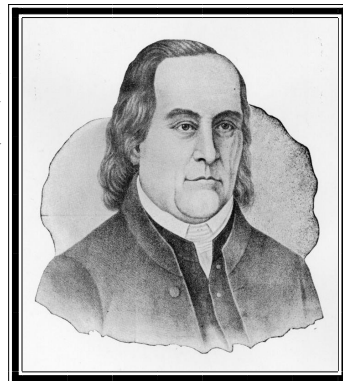

Dear Friends,

Travelling around the United States it is not unusual to come across churches by the name of "Otterbein United Methodist Church." There are at least three in easy driving distance to us – in Lebanon, in Rockville, and near West Lafayette.

Otterbein may be an unfamiliar name to you, but he was an important figure in the life of early American Methodism, and had a part to play in what eventually became the United Methodist Church. Born in Germany in 1726, Philip William Otterbein came to Pennsylvania at age 26, as a young German Reformed pastor. Otterbein met the great Mennonite preacher Martin Boehm, and their collaboration led to the formation of a new denomination, the United Brethren in Christ.



Otterbein also befriended the foremost Methodist preacher in America, Francis Asbury, and took part in his ordination at the Christmas Conference of 1784, where the Methodist Episcopal Church was officially formed. Otterbein and Asbury worked together in ministry for four decades, even holding bilingual worship services together.

The denomination Otterbein had helped form, the United Brethren in Christ, merged in 1946 with the Evangelical Church to form the Evangelical United Brethren Church (EUB). The EUB shared a great deal of history and theology with the larger Wesleyan movement, and in 1968 the EUB merged with the much larger Methodist Church, forming the present-day United Methodist Church.

Our denomination, and indeed the landscape of Christianity in America as a whole, would look very different had it not been for the dedicated clergyman known as William Otterbein. He passed away in 1813 at age 87, and was laid to rest in the churchyard of what is now Old Otterbein United Methodist Church in Baltimore, Maryland.

Plans were discussed for the next year's meetings including favors for the Mother Daughter banquet in May. It was stressed that all women of the church are welcomed to come to the meetings.

Sheila led the pledge service using 2 Corinthians 8:1-12 and Luke 6:38. The group was reminded to "give and it will be given to you." She opened and closed the program with prayer. Pledges were collected.

January 12, 2022

The annual dinner outing of the New Market United Methodist Men was called to order at 6:07 pm on Wednesday, January 12th, 2022, at the Pizza Hut location in Crawfordsville, President Dan Welliever presiding and the Secretary in attendance. There were 9 members and guests present. Bill Thomas provided transportation to and from the event for several members and guests.

The evening was opened in prayer by Bill Pike, after which members and guests visited and engaged in casual conversation. The members and guests then partook in a meal of pizza, pasta and sandwich dishes.

Upon completion of the meal, the business portion of the meeting was attended to. The Treasurer's Report was read and enumerated on by Dan Welliever; the current balance is \$1,830.04. The first item of business was a review of the United Methodist Men during 2021. During the previous year, the Men assembled eggs of candy for an Easter egg hunt and bags of candy for Santa; hosted a Father-Son banquet, an ice cream outing, and a picnic for the church; ran a food court to raise money during the church rummage sale; assembled the Nativity scene; and purchased several new tables for church use.

The second item of business was to discuss any changes to the Men's activities during the new year. The options of not running a food court this year, or of modifying the menu, and of hosting a Lenten breakfast again, were all discussed, but the matter was dismissed until the next meeting. At this point the Secretary's minutes were presented and approved as read.

Bill Pike then brought to the attention of the UMM that it is the church's 150th anniversary this year, and asked that we begin to think about different ways for the Men to celebrate this going forward. The meeting was then adjourned at 7:28 pm and members casually dispersed.

The next meeting will be Wednesday, February 9th, at 7:00 pm in the basement of the church. Larry Hulse will be the host.

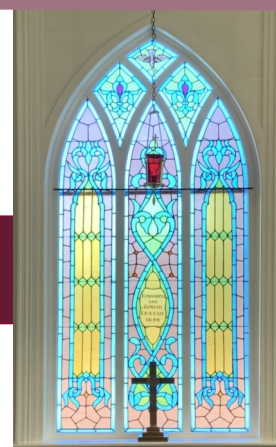
