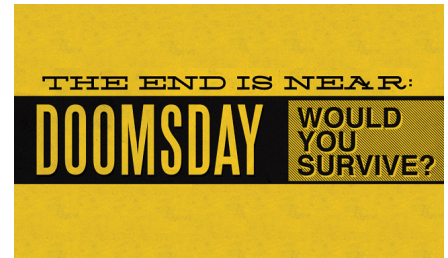

I. How to Interpret Biblical Prophecy?

- * Biblical prophecy should be interpreted (1) **literally**, (2) with a **futurist** view, and (3) in what is called a “premillennial” manner.

II. What Does the Bible Say Will Happen in the End Times?

- * Sadly, the Bible predicts a downward spiral of **catastrophes**, human sin, and religious **apostasy** before Christ returns (2 Tim. 3:1, 13). The world will continue to reject God, His Word, and His people.
