  - 1). A building committee was selected by Christ Lutheran's church council.
  - 2). Our architect, Davis Design, finished their specs on the gym. The pre-engineered metal building is currently out for bid. The bidding process should take 2-3 weeks.
  - 3). Our staff is starting to make decisions in preparation for demo this summer. 3<sup>rd</sup> grade is moving to the 04' addition. We are cleaning out extra rooms in the 84' addition to serve as a temporary office and workroom.
