HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *Praise to the Lord, the Almighty*. The theme of our Gospel reading today is mercy. Jesus instructs us to show mercy because we are children of the heavenly Father, and He is "kind to the ungrateful and the evil." *Praise to the Lord* reminds us of God's mercy. God is the one who gives us health (physical life) and salvation (spiritual life). God is the one who created us and cares for us. He is the one whose mercy daily attends us. He is the one who befriends us with his love. In a world full of anger, we only learn mercy, true mercy, as we learn it from the Lord.

A WORD: In our Gospel reading, Jesus says, "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you." Jesus instructs his disciples to respond to evil with the mercy of God, for He is "kind to the ungrateful and the wicked." We see an example of this in the Old Testament reading. Joseph is talking with his brothers, the same ones who had sold him into slavery years earlier. But Joseph responds to evil with mercy, inviting them to bring their families to Egypt so that he might provide for them through the famine.

Paul continues to teach us about the resurrection in the epistle reading. He reminds us that without hope for eternal life, there is no hope at all. We might as well eat and drink for tomorrow we die. But there is hope. Christ has been raised from the dead, and he will raise us from the dead as well.
