DB's Dabblings: "Hiring a Youth Minister for a Past Culture "

Because many churches try to be the church of their long-gone glory years, they make the mistake of trying to hire ministers to fit the past rather than to reach ahead into the future. There is probably no more evident practice of this than with Youth Ministers. While the job description may not say it, they are looking for someone to do a job that in many ways is outdated and unrealistic. The job description would more aptly speak of being an activities director for youth events that are without competing school academics, sports and extracurriculars. To be a qualified Biblical scholar who can teach Bible Classes in an entertaining way on Sunday morning and night, and Wednesday nights in an environment where the community refuses to schedule competing activities so the children can "go to church." And very important to the job would be to schedule and guide parent volunteers (especially the non-working moms who work full-time for their families) without getting in the way of the organization that does not need the Youth Minister's help to run effectively as a well-oiled machine. We all know this is not our current reality, but there is still a trend to evaluate the effectiveness of a Youth Minister on the basis of the performance in the above description.

So, will Graham Street Church of Christ in Stephenville, Texas do better? Not if we don't grow in understanding the needs of young people and the culture they live in, and as a whole church determine that every one of us in every generation will accept responsibility for raising up the younger generation in faith. Let me give you an example of our responsibility to teens.

Did you know that "anxiety is the most common psychological disorder in the US, affecting nearly onethird of adolescents and adults in their lifetime"? That means that a Youth Minister with 20 teens in his youth ministry may be dealing with 7 students that could be suffering from a diagnosable anxiety disorder. And that is based on BC research (Before Covid)!

During the COVID-19 pandemic, mental health challenges skyrocketed in the US. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, anxiety tripled (from 8.1 percent to 25.5 percent) and depression almost quadrupled (from 6.5 percent to 24.3 percent). Approximately half of young adults ages eighteen to twenty-four during the pandemic were wrestling with anxiety or depression. Suicide is currently the second leading cause of death for US young people ages ten to twenty-four. What's more, approximately two out of every three young people who have suicidal thoughts never get help. (**3 BIG Questions That Change Every Teenager**, p. 22)

Graham Street Church of Christ is organizing a **Mission Trip to Bowling Green, KY** to help with Tornado Relief and Rebuilding. The trip is **March 5th-11th** and will cost \$75 per person (\$50 for children 12 and under). This rate will cover lodging, meals (excluding travel days), and will help cover a portion of the building materials and other supplies. February 20th is the last day to sign up.

All ages are welcome, but students in 8th grade and below are required to have an accompanying adult sponsor that is willing to take responsibility for the student while on the trip.

Our group will likely assist in 2 specific ways:

1.) **Neighborhood Rebuilding Projects:** could be jobs such as roofing, framing, hanging dry-wall, etc.

2.) Volunteering at the Bowling Green Disaster Resource Center Storefront: sorting and stocking supplies, checking "shoppers" in, helping "shoppers" get what they need, etc.

In addition, we will be staying at <u>Big Reedy Christian Camp</u> (just north of Bowling Green), and will need some volunteers to stay at camp each day to help prepare and cook meals, provide childcare for some of the younger children, etc.




