DAY 4 Read Luke 7:40-47 focusing on Jesus.

What do you think Jesus' purpose is for this dinner meeting? Did the woman just show up or do you think Jesus intentionally set the table? What does Jesus want you to see about Him in this passage? What does He want you to see about you – and do you see it clearly? Pray for a clear vision of what Jesus is up to in your life right now.

DAY 5 Read Luke 7:48-50 focusing on Forgiveness & Faith.

Jesus tells the woman "Your sins are forgiven" (vs.48) – Is he repeating what already stated in vs.47 or something else? What was the response at the table to Jesus forgiving her and why is this so hard to grasp? What's the connection here between faith, forgiveness and going in peace? (Rom.5:1-2; Eph.2:8-9; Phil.4:6-9) Coming away from this table setting with Jesus, what's your practical application for the week? Pray from a grateful heart of adoration.

The Setting

Her tears fell on his feet, and she wiped them off with her hair. Then she kept kissing his feet and putting perfume on them. When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know what kind of woman is touching him. She's a sinner!"

The Savior

What does that perfume represent to you as a gift to Jesus? Now, back to reality – how are you like this woman and how do you practically show you adoration of Him? Pray for a repentant heart that shows adoration like this.

DAY 3 Read Luke 7:40-47 as if you were Simon the Pharisee.

What's your initial reaction to Jesus knowing your thoughts and what do you think Jesus is getting ready to tell you? How do you connect yourself in the story Jesus tells you and why? How did Jesus drive home his point to you and did you get it? Now, back to you personally – what's your main takeaway from Jesus' story to you? Pray for a heart of true worship before the Lord.
