This Sunday is the hinge between the Ordinary Time or season after the Epiphany and the penitential season of Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday. This is the moment that prepares us for that Lenten journey, even as it steeled Christ for the path of suffering. Therefore, it is a day of declaration, when we, once again, claim Jesus Christ as our Lord. We see him as he is, in a way, in this moment of Transfiguration. We don't have to fully understand all that might be happening here, but we do have to look in awe and wonder at the glory of our God. It is a day of celebration before a season of denial.

At the request of St. Mark's school advisory board, we will not administer ashes in a stop-and-go fashion during morning drop-off as planned. Instead, we will have a series of services in the sanctuary. The first, for the whole church, will be at 7:30 am and will include confession and imposition of the ashes.

Five times during the day, I will be leading chapel in the school for both elementary and middle school students, I will impose ashes at each service. The elementary school has chapel in the sanctuary at 8:30, 9:00, and 10:00 am and adults from the congregation are welcome in the sanctuary at that time.

In our Lenten journey, we know that perfectionism is impossible. But transformation isn't. And faith—a gift from God—is Good Enough.

Consider these words of Jesus, which are appropriate on Ash Wednesday.

And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting.

Truly I tell you, they have received their reward... but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21)

Jesus used the word "hypocrite" to describe those who put on airs in public to make people believe that they were holy, that their religious practice was... well... perfect. But their hearts were actually not in the practice, rather in the rewards that public approval could bring them—which is here today, often gone tomorrow.

Sometimes it is life itself that robs us of the shiny, perfect life that we had planned for ourselves. Global pandemic. Canceled events. A diagnosis. A broken heart. A lost opportunity. This Lent, rather than change for "the best," we'll seek to gain momentum one day at a time, "to reach for a faith that is never perfect, but good enough" (Bowler/Richie). In Christ,

## Christian MP says we must 'continue to have faith' as Russia-Ukraine tensions escalate

Christian MP Dr. Lisa Cameron is urging believers to pray" as the Government prepares for a "full-blown" invasion of Ukraine by the Russian military.

The White House has officially labeled Russia's movements on the border as an "invasion", prompting many others to do the same.

It's believed Putin has ordered forces to two separate areas of Ukraine for 'peacekeeping measures' - a move that many nations have condemned. The Prime Minister attended a COBRA meeting to discuss the action in Ukraine; sanctions have now been imposed.

A number of bank accounts have been closed - some of which belonged to friends of Putin with "a high net worth".

German Chancellor Angela Merkel has announced that the planned Russia-European oil pipeline will not be switched on.

The UK Prime Minister has said further sanctions are ready to be deployed.

However, despite the situation on the Ukrainian border, Dr. Lisa Cameron is urging people not to panic, saying that the best remedy is to take things "one step at a time" in order to achieve peace.

As a devout Christian, she stressed the importance of prayer.

Cameron, who also serves as vice-chair to the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Russia, said: "We must continue to have faith in the goodness of people and in the Lord guiding us through these periods of crisis. We should be praying for people, both in Ukraine and across Russia as well, to find common ground that would avert any further crisis unfolding here, and, you know,

"The main people who are affected in war are the most vulnerable, including children.

"We must do all possible to avert anything that would approximate that.

"We need to keep open the dialogue, we need to look at sanctions, and we need to make sure that peace and stability are at the heart of everything that we do moving forward.

"We must pray for everybody involved because I think that's the humanity of who we are."
