


A Lenten Pilgrimage Sundays, March 6-April 10

The Camino de Santiago, or the Way of St. James, is a pilgrimage of Medieval Origin to the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galicia, in the North West of Spain. Legend has it that the remains of the Apostle Saint James the Great were buried here and discovered by a shepherd in the 9th century.

Lent is a time of reflection, and there's nothing like a pilgrimage to conjure that up. Inspired by passages in the scriptures that talk about the journeys, roads, and pathways of life, we will make our "way" together through this poignant season. The movie "The Way" accompanies us as our modern-day inspiration to live the life we've been given to the fullest. 'you are there' through the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). Time after time, the PDA is one of the first and one of the most effective response teams to disaster sites.


Their work is supported by our annual 'One Great Hour of Sharing Offering' received on Palm Sunday.
