
#### **Installation of Assistant Pastor**

Six of the ten missionaries TBPC supports financially, or through prayer, attended in-person or through Zoom. We are delighted by this level of participation. Rene and Lilli Palacio intended to join through Zoom on Saturday but could not. Sadly, there was a death in the family. Do pray the Lord's comfort as the father of their daughter's husband passed away.

The conference began Friday with a wonderful evening of food and fellowship at the home of Martine Extermann. Dinner was catered by Smokey Bones. Saturday morning was a time for the church officers and Missions Committee to talk with our missionaries about their ministry, their needs, prayer requests, and other areas of interest or concern. Brian and Alisa Carrier provided an excellent breakfast enjoyed by the twenty-three in attendance. Saturday evening was an uplifting all-church event attended by about sixty when children were included. Eileen Fritz had a great program for the children. The dinner was catered by Olive Garden. We heard from our missionaries, sang some hymns, and Reverend Chad Brewer—our keynote speaker—wrapped up the evening as he shared information most did not know concerning the mission of Reformed University Fellowship. Sunday brought the conference to conclusion with an inspiring message from Reverend Brewer during worship. His sermon was titled "From Every Campus to Every Country." Reformed University Fellowship has indeed expanded into missions while maintaining its focus on colleges and universities.

Our conference began a new year of missions support. The Missions Fund runs from March 1, 2022 to February 28, 2023. The budget is \$47,645. It includes a five-percent increase in support for our missionaries. The Missions Ministry "Missionary Profiles" booklet, put together by Nancy Morrison with help from Melissa Bayley, provides a more detailed breakout of the Missions Fund Budget. Please be sure you have a Profiles booklet to learn more about our missionaries, to pray for them, and to take part in missions. Your pledged support is truly appreciated. Our missionaries depend on TBPC's support as well as that of other churches.

As the year unfolds, you will hear more about TBPC's missions endeavor. The Missions Committee encourages you to take part and to consider joining the Missions Committee. The Scriptures are clear. The Gospel must be proclaimed throughout the world before Christ comes. Missions is crucial to seeing the establishment of Christ's eternal kingdom.

#### Sister-to-Sister

The first Spiritual Mothering Mentor Meeting, held on February 12, went well. The ladies talked about everyday life and even touched on difficult conversations.

As a result of the meeting, the ladies decided that mentoring should happen as a result of the ladies of the church attending monthly Sister-to-Sister gatherings, getting to know each other, and asking individuals to mentor them if they so choose after relationships have been built.

The key is to attend the gatherings in order to be around each other, talk, and cultivate relationships.

The topic of the meeting referred to above was conceived of and put together by Ashley Powe with the help of Rachel Contrata who wrote a wonderful devotion designed specifically for this meeting. Rachel was unable to attend so her devotion was beautifully delivered by Barbara Hess.

Many ladies have asked for a copy of the devotion. The following are Rachel's notes.

### Mentorship for Women in the Church

When I think of mentorship, a number of things jump to my mind. First thing, I would love a mentor! But then in the very next breathe asking someone to be my mentor terrifies me. Mentorship is something you hear about at the workplace and often there is little to no follow through and it is rarely effectively used from my experience.

But what does the Bible tell us about mentorship? Does God call us to be mentors? The answer is yes! God calls us to be a teacher throughout the whole Bible as well as to continue to be learning from others. There is never a moment on this Earth that we are ever done growing or teaching. Here are just a couple of different verses. "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: If either of them falls down, one can help the other up. But pity anyone who falls and has no one to help them up" (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10). "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another" (Proverbs 27:17). "I myself am convinced, my brothers and sisters, that you yourselves are full of goodness, filled with knowledge and competent to instruct one another" (Romans 15:14).

As most of you know, Pastor Freddy officiated Anthony and my wedding service five years ago come this October. Prior to our getting married, he put us through some very long and very difficult marriage counseling. Thirteen one-hour sessions before we were married and a six-week, six-month, and then one-year check up after we were married. Yes, you heard that correctly. Side note: when people say they met the pastor for an hour or two

just a week or so before their wedding, I laugh out loud! ANYWAYS one of the things Pastor Freddy continued to challenge us to do was find a mentor for our brand-new marriage. He told us we should find an older, Godcentered couple, whose marriage we admired and ask them to mentor us as newly weds. Pastor Freddy challenged me to recognize that mentorship can go past just workplace and can be very effective in our day-to-day life especially, in the life of the church.

While ultimately we never actually asked anyone to be our mentor, I still think about it all the time. I think about the couples whose marriages shine God's light and love. I wish I had, and continue to think I should ask a wife to mentor me. I also think about who would be a good mentor in this crazy, hard journey of motherhood. What older, wiser woman whom I see so effortlessly mother her children with God's love being cast to all those who see her. I have specific people and multiple people in mind when I say that. Why do I continue to let my self doubt and fear of someone thinking I am crazy keep me from asking someone to be my mentor? Why do I continue to think that it's better to muddle through life spending every moment just trying to "figure it out on my own" when I have so many godly women of sound judgement who surround me with knowledge and skills that may be able to help provide me with more of God's peace and joy and less frustration? Why do I continue to rely on only myself when we are stronger and wiser together? After this Sister-to-Sister and divulging these inner-most thoughts, maybe this will be enough of an ice-breaker to allow me to feel comfortable and content enough to ask for one mentor and then hopefully another and another until I have so many godly mentors I never find myself alone. Because why limit yourself to only one mentor?

So with that I bring you to the book of Titus. Now before jumping to the obvious section of Titus 2:3-5, I want to start at the beginning of Titus quickly. According to the footnotes in my Bible, Paul's purpose in writing this letter to Titus is "to advise Titus in his responsibility of supervising the churches on the island of Crete." He starts chapter 1 and discusses the leadership of the church and how to appoint elders who love what is good and then rebuke those who fail to do good. This is very important. If we do not first have a solid foundation, in which the cornerstone is the one true God, we have nothing. If we are being led astray, mentorship will not cause you peace and joy in life but instead additional confusion and frustration.

It is only after leadership that Paul talks about mentorship in chapter 2. Now I do not know about everyone else's Bible but my Bible labels chapter 2 as "Right Living in the Church." How appropriate then that there is a whole paragraph that focuses on women and mentorship. So here is Titus 2:3-5:

"Likewise, teach the older women to be reverent in the way they live, not to be slanderers or addicted to much wine, but to teach what is good. Then they can urge the younger women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled and pure, to be busy at home, to be kind, and to be subject to their husbands, so that no one will malign the word of God."

God made women to be communal. God made women to be mentors. God made us to need and want each other's company. God did not make us and call us to be alone. He called us to be in communion with one another, to stand by each other, to support each other and provide for each other. It is important to note here though that again this is right on the heels of good leadership and rebuking those who fail to do good. Selecting a mentor should not be something done just willy-nilly. We need to find mentors who are of solid faith and foundation. We should find women in which God will continue to grow us in faith and understanding.

We are taught to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions "and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age" (Titus 2:12).

Asking someone to become your mentor should not be taken lightly! So once I have picked my mentor and she agrees, what then should we do with our mentors? Paul does not tell in the book of Titus exactly what to do other than to teach, always. So going back to my marriage counseling sessions, Pastor Freddy advised that we should meet with our mentors regularly. Do not stop seeking counsel. Not only should we seek counsel when things are bad but also in times of good. He recommended that meetings be set up regularly and more frequently at first and then maybe over the years they taper off as they become less needed for counseling and more just catching up and friendship as you become better equipped. I think Paul would agree as he goes on to write chapter 3 which my Bible labels as "Right Living in Society." First, we had to have the "Leadership of the Church" which appointed leaders who love good and rebuke those not doing good making our strong foundation. Second, we have "Right living in the Church" which is based around mentorship with likeminded godly women. And then his third section Is "Right living in Society" as prior to our leaderships and mentorships we are not ready to face society without losing sight of God.

Paul also adds the following in his final remarks of the letter in Titus 3:14: "Our people must learn to devote themselves in doing good, in order to provide for urgent needs and not live unproductive lives."

Lastly however, I want to read this passage again. If when you first heard this passage you thought of yourself as the younger women getting mentored, when I read it again reverse your role and think of yourself as the mentor or visa versa. So here is Titus 2:3-5 again; "Likewise, teach the older women to be reverent in the way they live, not to be slanderers or addicted to much wine, but to teach what is good. Then they can urge the younger women to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled and pure, to be busy at home, to be kind, and to be subject to their husbands, so that no one will malign the word of God."

No matter your age, your place in life, abilities, or struggles we are all mentors just as much as we are the younger women. As a young wife and mother of two, it is so very easy for me to think about all the godly women who surround me that I look up to. But it is so very important to remember that others are also looking to me, even if I do not know it. How many people could I mentor in life? What advise would I give? How could I be an effective mentor? I too am called to teach other women and not just learn. It is important not only to continue to learn from others but also live as if others are learning from me.

I pray that we, as women, become wonderful learners and teachers to one another and that God breaks the ice for us and allows us to be open and vulnerable to one another to allow us to create mentorships. Amen.

# **ESL**

## English as a Second Language (ESL) Update Karen Cross, Coordinator

The ESL Program is experiencing growth in both students and volunteers! God has blessed our Program in so many ways!

In January we completed a Citizenship Application and Exam class. One student that was in the class passed her Interview Exam and became a US Citizen in January!

The students in one of our Beginner Level 1 Classes finished their books and transitioned into a Beginner Level 2 Class. These students have really improved in reading, speaking, and understanding English and are excited to move to the next level in their studies.

We added two new classes in February. The first new class we added is an evening Beginner Level 2 class. This class is composed of a majority of students that work during the day. The students have been asking for this class and are so excited and happy to attend! All of the students in this class have finished taking the Level 1 English Class and have been ready to move to the next level.

The second class we added in February is a Friday afternoon conversation class. Many students have been asking for more practice with conversation. This class reached maximum capacity before they held their first class! This class has a variety of skill levels yet they are working well together engaging in conversation skills. We hope to add another in-person conversation class on Tuesday mornings, soon.

Currently, we have a total of eight classes each week:

- 1. Two Beginner Level 1 Classes;
- 2. Two Beginner Level 2 Classes;
- 3. Two Intermediate Level 3 Classes;
- 4. One Advanced Level 4 Class; and,
- 5. One Conversation Class.

We have a total of forty-seven actively participating students and seven additional students that attend periodically when they are not working. Of the forty-seven actively participating students, thirty-two of them take more than one class. Many students take three or more classes. Almost all of the students live in the New Tampa or Wesley Chapel area.

We have a total of sixteen volunteers that are teaching or assisting in classes. The support from our congregation has been tremendous, and we are grateful for each and every volunteer! As we continue to add new students, it becomes necessary to add new volunteers.

We are so grateful to God that we get to help these students with learning to communicate in English, which helps them to assimilate into the community! We are especially grateful to share Scripture, Devotions, Praise Music, and Prayer in each and every class. It has been a wonderful school year filled with many blessings!

The website is complete, but we are looking for someone to help maintain it. This would involve weekly/monthly document uploads and new or updated pages as needed. No experience necessary.

The position would require approx. 20 minutes per week. Training will be provided.

## **Help Needed on Sundays!**

- **AV TEAM** needs soundboard operators and someone to run the Worship Service slides one Sunday per Month. No experience needed we will train you. If you can run PowerPoint slides, you can run the Sunday Service slides!
- Nursery attendants needed one Sunday per month. Childcare training will be provided if not already completed.

- **Hospitality Coordinator** needed. This is a leadership position. The coordinator has general oversight of all hospitality events and oversees kitchen management: supplies, organization, equipment, laundry, frozen food storage, and writing kitchen procedures as needed. The coordinator also recruits and schedules the refreshment team for after-church fellowship.
- **Hospitality Refreshment Team Members** needed one Sunday per month. Several areas of need are involved in this position: 1.
