I see church congregations in our synod reinventing how they worship, moving online and engaging people who would never have walked into their doors before. I see our Community Education ministry tutors and students connecting in new ways, willing to navigate some challenges in order to get there. I see you bearing the Holy Spirit fruits of patience and generosity as we figure out new ways to worship together. I see people serving and caring for those who suffer, and struggle, and grieve. I see generosity of support and self and heart. I see people in our country with vastly different points of view listening to each other with patience and a mutual desire to understand. I see long-established unjust systems being exposed to the

light and honest and respectful conversations happening about them. I see the Holy Spirit of God moving among us, birthing a resurrection life among us. Birth is painful; birth is arduous. But it brings forth new life.

And so I give thanks for how God has been present with us in the past: bringing the Israelites out of slavery, speaking through the prophets to awaken justice for the lost and the least, walking with us, teaching us of God's reign, dying for us, raising us with Christ. And I give thanks for how God is present with us today: freeing, awakening, accompanying, leading, teaching, raising.

In and amidst the pains and losses that you have or are experiencing this year, or in those that people you love have or are experiencing this year, I wonder if there are blessings emerging. I wonder if there are signs of God's resurrection life beginning to reveal themselves to your eyes.

While we cry out with the psalmist, "How long, O Lord?" let us also recount with the psalmist the deeds of our mighty and faithful God who never leaves us or forsakes us. Let us call those deeds to mind and recite them morning and night to remember the steadfast love of God and to trust the God who always and ever leads us to new life.

CONGRATULATIONS, TERESA OCAMPO!

Please join the Community Education team's celebration of another program participant who has passed one of the GED exams. Teresa Ocampo passed the social studies exam on October 5th. While working at her full time job over the past two years, Teresa has been making steady progress toward earning her GED certificate. Volunteers Leticia Luse supported Teresa's science test preparation and Alyson Stephens guided her prep for the civics and social studies exams. Eva Torres, Central Lutheran's Community Education Tutoring Coordinator, remembers tutoring Teresa during her weekly study sessions for her first exam in mathematics. Eva recalled, "Tere was a student who

was always very diligent in her studies. She seemed hungry to learn, which is motivating for any tutor. That same drive and desire to learn are what has led Tere to succeed in every test. As she gets closer to getting her GED certificate, her nerves and fear of the tests have gone away. Now, she is a stronger person and independent -- just like a butterfly coming out of its cocoon."

Teresa was born in Tequila in the state of Jalisco, Mexico. She enjoys going shopping, watching TV shows, walking in parks and hiking in the mountains. Teresa began her pursuit of the GED with the goal of finding better employment. She knew that education would broaden her job opportunities. Teresa shared, "Passing each test has given me confidence that I am able to learn new things," Now, with her impressive milestones of exam achievement to build on, she believes she will be able to get even better jobs and her personal goals continue to expand. "Once I graduate, I want to prepare to become a U.S. citizen."

Looking ahead and with math, science, civics and social studies exams behind her, Teresa is turning her attention to the last exam, language arts. This last exam is often considered the most challenging as it focuses on reading comprehension, literary fiction and non-fiction analysis, and persuasive writing skills. However, Teresa has proven her ability to succeed, so don't be surprised when her earned GED certificate announcement comes soon.

Teresa wrote, "I thank the congregation for the support it gives the GED students so that we can achieve our goals."

For most, the signs of autumn conjure thoughts of sweaters and changing leaves. For those at Prison Fellowship, autumn means it's Angel Tree season!

This year, includes new preparations to ensure every child gets served, regardless of any COVID-19-related restrictions at Christmastime.

It appears we are on track to have **215,000 children** to serve this year—praise Jesus! We know gifts shared through Angel Tree lead to improved relationships between incarcerated parents and their children. And the joy that results when children wake up on Christmas to see that their mom or dad in prison has not forgotten them is simply priceless. That's why we dedicate ourselves each year to ensuring that every Angel Tree child gets served. And since prison visits have been prohibited for more than six months, this Christmas it's more important than ever to keep families connected through Angel Tree this Christmas.

Unfortunately, because of the pandemic, the number of churches and groups signing up to serve Angel Tree children with a gift and the Gospel on behalf of their incarcerated parent is behind schedule.

Central Lutheran Church will help with the 2020 Angel Tree program! We will figure out a way to help these children. Life Line Screening Here This Month

Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings, is pleased to offer a preventive health event at Central Lutheran Church **Casa Grande location** on **November 30.** Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. Register for a Wellness Package which includes 4 vascular tests and osteoporosis screening from \$149 (\$139 with our member discount). All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete. Financial Report

Good day and God's blessing to you all. I would like to give you a financial update on the church's status at this time. As most of you know this has been a tough time for the congregation. Out of the first ten (10) months of the year we have failed to meet our financial obligations eight out of the ten months. In essence, our expenses have exceeded our offerings. In comparing the offerings from this year to last year we have had a considerable short fall. I firmly believe this is attributed to the Covid Virus and the fact we have not been able to worship together as a congregation until just recently at the outdoor services. Moreover, our expenses have exceeded our offerings by \$31,149.00 through the end of October. On several occasions it was necessary to transfer money from our Capital Reserve Account to cover our basic expenses.

In an attempt to curb our expenses, the following actions were recommended to the Church Council and approved over the past six (6) months.

- Since June we have only been paying the interest on the church mortgage. The interest on the mortgage is \$511.63 per month and the normal mortgage payment is \$3767.00. We are presently scheduled to resume making the full mortgage payment starting in December of this year.
- In October, we reduced our offering to the Synod from \$1667.67 to \$666.67.
- In June we were to start paying rent in the amount of \$1000.00 per month for our Casa Grande Church site. Based on the generosity of Ruth Kramer and the Cooper Family this has not been initiated as of yet.
- In July we changed Internet Service providers in Arizona City to Mitriinks. They
 do not charge churches for Internet service. By making the change we save
 \$100.00 per month.

As I stated above, it has been a rough year meeting our obligations. I would like to thank each and every one of you for your contributions and prayers. With our winter visitors returning, hopefully our financially situation will start to improve.





CONTINUING TO LOVE OUR NEIGHBOR

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:34-35

For the good of our neighbors and ourselves, we continue to practice physicaldistancing due to the COVID-19 coronavirus. It is an airborne respiratory illness that can easily spread from person to person. As Christians, it seems strange to show God's love by keeping physical distance from each other, but this is precisely what we are called to do at this time.

Throughout the Old and New Testaments, God calls us to care for the most vulnerable among us to make God's love for them known through our actions. So we continue to wear cloth face coverings, keep a minimum of 6 feet between us, washing our hands frequently and for a minimum of 20 seconds, covering our mouth and nose with a tissue or our sleeve (not our hands) when coughing or sneezing, etc —all to keep our neighbors safe. Loving our neighbor as Christ has called us to do happens in context, in this age and every age.

Thank you for your faithfulness as we follow this call to love and serve. Thank you for all you have done and are continuing to do. We've been doing this for months now, and we're not out of the woods yet; you may be feeling the fatigue of this constant vigilance. Many of us are. You might be experiencing the feelings of sadness, grief, fear, annoyance, anger, relief, guilt, confusion. God knows what you are feeling—talk with Him about it honestly. God will receive you in love and mercy.

Let us be united and let us not grow weary in this shared commitment to love our neighbors. The Holy Spirit is with us, and it is by the power of the Holy Spirit that we

can be inspired for continued commitment.

We continue to suspend indoor gatherings in our church buildings. We are now offering in-person worship services outdoors, and those worship services will be recorded for those whose health prevents them from gathering in-person with others. As the medical and scientific communities continue to learn about COVID-19, it has been found that this airborne virus spreads most effectively where people gather in enclosed spaces for extended amounts of time. This calls us to be particularly vigilant about gathering in-person for worship or other events. Our decisions will be based on scientific and medical information, and in conversation with the Arizona Department of Health Services and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America at the churchwide and local levels.

Let us continue to hold one another in mutual love, caring for the most vulnerable among us. Let us join together in worship, whether in-person outdoors or from our homes; continue sending in our offerings by mail, PayPal, or through our financial institutions; continue reaching out to one another through phone calls, emails, a caring note in the mail; continue showing our compassion and understanding to all.
