### Reflecting Jesus

The Old Testament people lived at the crossroads of the world so people of other nations would learn to know God by watching them. Jesus gave the same command to his followers. Outsiders were to see and observe them and learn of their God and the ministry of Jesus. Unfortunately, many Christians have not lived in ways that allow others to see Jesus in their lives.



There are periods in history when Christians have behaved in a way that turned others away from God. Many times the conduct of Christians has not been consistent with the teachings of Jesus. It has been easy for misguided Christians to justify methods and attitudes other than those taught by Jesus because of a personal belief of being right. Walls have been built between Christians and others that have created a defensive or isolationist mentality in communities. Human interpretation has often lost sight of Jesus' message in order to fit personal agendas.

Jesus gave clear instructions for his followers to continue the mission he had begun. They were to build his church, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and care for the lonely. He gave a stirring call to be peacemakers and servants so his people

could be "salt" and "light." Christians were to follow Jesus' way of love, kindness, and self-sacrifice. The Old Testament call to live "so that the world may know" God was still in force.

Therefore, it is important for Christians to model their attitudes and behaviors after Jesus, reflecting the light of Jesus in a dark world. For it may be necessary to build bridges between Christianity and those who have been wounded by sinful behavior that has failed to reflect Jesus.

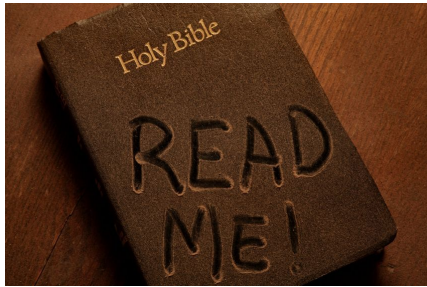
All women are invited to be a part of the study and

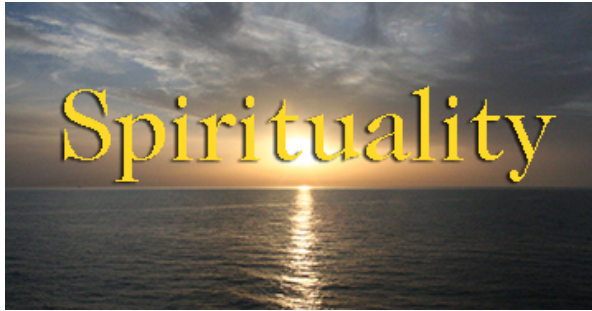

## "Good Gifts" Ministry

Malawi is a landlocked country in southeast Africa that was formerly known as Nyasaland. The topography of the country is defined by highlands split by the Great Rift Valley and enormous Lake Malawi, which takes up about one-third of Malawi's area.

The population of Malawi is estimated at a little over 18 million. This estimate takes into account a lower life expectancy, and higher infant deaths, due to AIDS.

Malawi is among the world's least-developed countries. The economy is heavily based on agriculture, with a largely rural population. The government depends on outside aid to meet development needs. There are challenges in building and expanding the economy, improving education, healthcare, environmental protection, and becoming financially independent amidst widespread overpopulation and unemployment.

Our congregational campaign raised \$8,783, which has been increased to \$10,000 by the church council. These funds will allow us to partner with the Malawi Health and Wellness program. Through the direction of the Lutheran Church of Malawi our funds will be used to provide access to clean water, sanitation, livestock, farm equipment, fruit trees, medical supplies and medicines, school materials, and mosquito netting.

This is a specific breakdown of expenses:

- 2 simple water wells
- 4 latrines
- 1 fish farm
- 1 fruit tree nursery
- 4 women attending farming school
- 20 sets of farm tools
- 4 piglets
- 10 chicks

5 roosters  
2 pair of goats  
4 colonies of honey bees  
1 month of medical supplies  
1 classroom of school supplies  
1 community of mosquito netting.

## Internship Fund

The \$20,848 of contributions received for the internship program have been invested in an ELCA Mission Investment Fund account. The council will continue to evaluate the possibility of participating in the internship program in the futures or applying to other staffing needs.

Special note: At the annual meeting in January, it was approved to use \$6,000 of the fund to support the work of our tutor for our GED program this year.
