

A Love Story

Several times in his ministry,
Jesus alluded to the typical 1st
century marriage practices to
illustrate his relationship with
us. Not all scholars agree on
the details of courtship and
marriage in Israel at that time,
yet it is important for us to
take from this discussion that



Jesus often described his love for us with the metaphor of a marriage celebration.

People in Galilee often lived in family units called "insulae." (pictured) Although not everyone lived in this way, it was common for people, particularly extended families, to combine several living units around an open courtyard.


It is possible Jesus and his disciples lived in such a compound in Capernaum (Mark 2:1-2; 7:17). This is not definite but the reference to "household" would indicate the house size needed from him and his disciples makes this likely. The practice of living in such a complex is the basis for one of Jesus' pictures of heaven (John 14:2-4).

The metaphor of marriage is one of the most compelling of Jesus' teaching ministry. An engagement at the time was as serious as marriage. The families agreed on compensation for the loss of a daughter, usually a large sum. The life commitment of bride and groom was sealed by drinking a cup of wine.

The engaged bridegroom returned to his father's household and began to construct a new living unit to the family compound. The groom to be would work tirelessly, eager to complete the dwelling so he could claim his bride. His father would oversee the work, perhaps to make sure the anxious young man would us good building practices. When the father determined everything was ready, he gave his blessing for the wedding ceremony to proceed. Generally, the engagement period was one year, though no one knew exactly when the wedding would take place.

Then the groom brought his friends and family to the bride's town. They would announce their coming with singing, dancing, and shouting. The bride and her attendants would be taken to the new home together. When the marriage was consummated the wedding feast would begin.

We can grasp the depth's of Jesus' love for us based on the metaphor of the loving marriage relationship. The great joy of the marriage relationship gives us the ability to comprehend what personal, powerful love Jesus has for us and what he wants us to have for him.



Our adult students have had great success in their ongoing study programs. We have had 8 students pass the math test, 7 language arts, 8 science, 8 social studies, and, 9 civics. Two participants, Yazmin and Hector, have recently completed their GED tests. Four new students have recently joined the program.

Our ESL language classes now have 25 active participants with 20 coaches!

Our part time Spanish speaking tutor, Eva, has continued to be a great asset to our ministry.

Malawi is a landlocked country in southeast Africa that was formerly known as Nyasaland. The topography of the country is defined by highlands split by the Great Rift Valley and enormous Lake Malawi, which takes up about one-third of Malawi's area.

The population of Malawi is estimated at a little over 18 million. This estimate takes into account a lower life expectancy, and higher infant deaths, due to AIDS.

Malawi is among the world's least-

developed countries. The economy is heavily based on agriculture, with a largely rural population. The government depends on outside aid to meet development needs. There are challenges in building and expanding the economy, improving education, healthcare, environmental protection, and becoming financially independent amidst widespread overpopulation and unemployment.

Our congregational campaign raised \$8,783, which has been increased to \$10,000 by the church council. These funds will allow us to partner with the Malawi Health and Wellness program. Through the direction of the Lutheran Church of Malawi our funds will be used to provide access to clean water, sanitation, livestock, farm equipment, fruit trees, medical supplies and medicines, school materials, and mosquito netting.

This is a specific breakdown of expenses:

- 2 simple water wells
- 4 latrines
- 1 fish farm
- 1 fruit tree nursery
- 4 women attending farming school
- 20 sets of farm tools
- 4 piglets
- 10 chicks
- 5 roosters
- 2 pair of goats
- 4 colonies of honey bees
- 1 month of medical supplies
- 1 classroom of school supplies
- 1 community of mosquito netting.

Special note: At the annual meeting in January, it was approved to use \$6,000 of the fund to support the work of our tutor for our GED program this year.
