#### WITNESSES TO CHRIST: PEOPLE FROM HIS PASSION

John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:30–31). Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life—abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life.

Historically, the Fourth Gospel is likened to an eagle—an image that suggests John soars to heights of glory and grandeur. That's because the evangelist paints a stunning portrait of Jesus, who is the bread of life, the resurrection and the life, and the way, the truth, and the life. Life in Jesus. That's God's gift to you!

This Lent, our life in Christ will be strengthened as we hear the witness of those in John's Gospel who journeyed to the cross. Along the way, we'll meet villains, such as Barabbas and Pontius Pilate, as well as sinners, such as Peter (who denied Jesus *three* times), and Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by *seven* demons).





#### **CALL TO ORDER & DEVOTIONS**

The meeting was called to order by Steve Gierhan. Pastor led the devotion, Acts 18. Apollos came to Ephesus. He had not heard of Jesus requesting that you be baptized in the name of the Lord, he knew only of the baptism of John. He learned more from Priscilla & Aquila. Apollos was very influential. They plan to send letters to members with photos of their Elder that belongs to each shepherd list. Pastor Rob and the Elders will be sharing shut-in visit duties, with Pastor doing a 1/3 and the two Elder teams take the others, then rotating each month, so Pastor sees each shut once every three months.. The Easter Lenten schedule was discussed. They are still working on filling a cast for the Last Supper pageant.

#### PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Rob reported that the Pastor at Trinity Amherst has received a call. There are 5 churches participating in the Lenten Luncheons this year. Trinity will be hosting the Lenten Luncheon on March 17<sup>th</sup>. We are using Shepard's Staff for software, last year we went to Faithlife, and we have been having some issues and trying to work those out, bust since Faithlife purchased Servant Keeper we were able to begin using that program for free and it works like Shepherd's Staff before they changed the program and we had troubles that prompted us to make the switch. The copier lease is up and we will be getting a new copier.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

By-law committee has started reviewing the by-laws. The two big changes will be to look at combining the Board of Education & Youth to one committee and also combining Stewardship & Elders. A proposal would have to be brought to the voters. A reminder was given to turn in your Foundation grants or applications.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

The Nominating Committee will consist of Pastor Rob, Peg, Don, & Eric. We will need to fill Education/Youth, Planning, Trustee, & Elder Elect. Two nominees will be needed for Foundation & Vice Chair. The 100 Year Church Anniversary will be celebrated in 2030 and a committee will need to be formed at the Voter's Meeting.
