Rev. James and Angie Sharp (Elias, Ambrose, Callida, Magdalyn) are missionaries in Uruguay. Christ Lutheran Church supports this family in South America. They are returning to Uruguay in March. Having made 13 presentations while on home service in the states, Pastor explains "home service" in his last newsletter. "Home Service is not a vacation and it isn't a furlough. Home Service is service! Even though we will put a lot of miles on the van and maybe not know what state we are in from time to time, we really enjoy it. We like to meet new people and see supporters who are now old friends. We love telling people what we are doing and saying thanks in person for their support. We have to schedule our Home Service around Angie and the kids' school schedule, so it has to be in our summer in Uruguay which is winter up north. Not the best time to drive around the Upper Midwest, but it's what we have to do. Every time we come home, we try to go to places we haven't been before. IT'S ABOUT TIME!

Next week (March 13) is time change weekend. We push our clocks ahead one hour as most of the nation goes to Daylight Savings Time. Perhaps the kids will protest the earlier bedtime as parents try to explain that, although the clock says 8:00, it's really 9:00. Even adults can find it a challenge to adjust to the time change.

We're all affected by time, especially when we "lose" an hour. Time is a non-renewable resource and, therefore, very valuable. St. Paul attests to the value of time: "Be very careful, then, how you live – not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is" (Ephesians 5:15-17).

What is the Lord's will? He is the giver of time, as He is of every gift. For what purpose does He give gifts to the Church? In Ephesians 4:11-3, we learn that they are to be used to "prepare God's people for works of service, so that the Body of Christ may be built up."

Just as we use our talents and abilities and our money for God's Kingdom, so should we be wise in the use of our time. By His death and resurrection, Jesus has freed us from worry and bondage to sin and for service. Let us make this transition time a time to reflect on the ministry opportunities God places before us and to resolve to set aside meaningful blocks of time for the Lord's work.
