

What the Lord is Doing Through Our Afflictions

> 2 Corinthians 4:7-18 March 6, 2022

<u>The Big Idea</u>: From the time Adam and Eve were banished from the garden, life has been hard and at times full of unbearable frustration and pain. Christians have a unique opportunity in life to see that they are not alone and that God is working, even in their pain. Through every affliction you face the Lord is working to bring about something for your ultimate good and for His own glory.

2 Corinthians 4:7-18 (ESV)

⁴ ⁷ But we have <u>this treasure in jars of clay</u>, to show that <u>the surpassing</u> power belongs to God and not to us. ⁸We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; ⁹ persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; ¹⁰ always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that <u>the life of Jesus</u> may also be manifested in our bodies. ¹¹ For <u>we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus</u>' <u>sake</u>, so that the <u>life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh</u>. ¹² So death is at work in us, but life in you.

¹³ Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, *"I believed, and so I spoke,"* we also believe, and so we also speak, ¹⁴ knowing that <u>he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also</u> with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. ¹⁵ For it is all for your sake, so that *as grace extends* to more and more people *it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.*

¹⁶ <u>So we do not lose heart</u>. Though **our outer self is wasting away**, our **inner self is being renewed** day by day. ¹⁷ For this *light momentary* **affliction** is preparing for us **an eternal weight of glory** <u>beyond all</u> <u>comparison</u>, ¹⁸ as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the **things that are seen are transient**, but the **things that are unseen are eternal**.

God's Purposes in Our Problems

- 1. He makes His power known in our weaknesses. (v. 7)
- 2. He sustains His children through every hard moment, but never allows us to be destroyed. (vv. 8-9)
- 3. He gives us life through Jesus, even as we are suffering and dying in this world. (vv. 10-12)
- 4. In troubled times He teaches us to live by faith that is based on the Resurrection of Jesus. (vv. 13-14)
- 5. He multiplies His grace in our lives which increases our gratitude and brings glory to God. (v. 15)
- 6. He gives us a brand new perspective on life and reasons for hope ...
 - Even as we are facing trouble and our bodies are dying, Christ in inwardly renewing us. (v. 16)
 - Every affliction we face, no matter how tragic will last only a "few moments" and will eventually fade in the glory of God's eternal being. (v. 17)
 - The things we see will one day cease to be. But, we can't see what God has made to last forever. (v. 18)
