## **Mission Memo ... Pray for Church Workers Around the World & in our Community**

**Johanna Heidorn is a Communication Specialist to Latin America and Caribbean Region.** (She began her missionary journey after the 2017 Big Mission Event helping her to Asia, the Hong Kong region.) After her recent home service, she returned to The Dominican Republic and now lives legally on the island another year. She reports that schools are open again in the Dominican and Lutheran schools have a great influx of students and attendance. After many years and shipments of books, the Concordia El Reformador Seminary now has a library of resources for students to access as they study to become pastors. In Uruguay nine children were confirmed this past month, seven of which are from the Lutheran school. The missionaries in Belize are out of Bibles so they have been doing trips to the border of Guatemala to retrieve more. In Peru Elvis Carrera, a recent graduate of the seminary in the Dominican was ordained, making him the first Lutheran Peruvian pastor in the church's history. **Thank God for His blessing on the work of missionaries in Latin America and Caribbean Region.**
