
There is an old saying about Texas weather, "if you don't like it just wait". Change is ok for the weather but it is hard for our relationships both personal and at work.

The month of March is upon us. The winter cold now has retreated to but a memory. The spring like temperatures and the greening of nature remind us of the changing of the season. March brings us to a time of reflection. Reflection on what has been and reflection on what is to come. Much of who we are and what we have done are tied into our past.

March also leads us to celebration. One of my favorites is the St. Patrick's Day celebration. St. Patty's day brings out the Irish in all of us. It is celebrated as a religious holiday in Ireland to remember their patron St. Patrick. History tells us that St. Patrick was a missionary to Ireland from 433AD to 460AD. At the age of sixteen, Patrick, the son of a Roman official in Britton, was carried off to Ireland by marauders and bound into slavery. He served as a shepherd for his druid master. There he learned the Celtic tongue and druid ways. After six years, he was warned by an angel to escape and follow God.

The experiences that he had faced brought him back again to the people and customs that had held him captive. In 433, he returned to Ireland using his knowledge of the people and druidic customs to convert them to Christianity. His use of the shamrock to teach the local people about the Trinity is still used today. Although legend has it that he charmed the snakes out of Ireland, the snakes were probably the druid symbols of the serpent. Patrick died on March 17, 493AD. The land that had once held him captive now declared freedom through Jesus Christ. All thanks to a shepherd lad who responded to God's calling.

Today, as I write this, it is March 2nd. It is Texas Independence Day. It marks a time in our history that we shed our captivity to live in a new hope. Lenten season marks a time of reflection to free us from all that holds us captive. It may be time, food, relationships, belongings, and activities. It is a time of giving up worldly things up for God. Releasing all that holds us captive so that we can find the freedom we have in Christ, our hope. A time of new birth and re-creation.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come; The old has gone, the new is here." 2 Corinthians 5:17

Become the new creation that God has in store for you. Cast off those chains of fear, unworthiness, and isolation and run to the Father who is waiting for you. The debt has been paid. The table has been set. Accept the invitation of Christ and become the new creation that God has in store for you.


