HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *All Depends on Our Possessing*. The theme of this hymn is the certainty of life, eternal life, when we build on God's grace. Verse 3 says, "Many spend their lives in fretting over trifles and in getting things that have no solid ground. I shall strive to win a treasure that will bring me lasting pleasure and that now is seldom found." Our epistle reading reminds us of the same thing. We are not to set our minds on the things of earth. That way ends in destruction. Our citizenship is in heaven. We are waiting for a savior, Jesus Christ, and whatever pain or difficulty we experience on earth, it will all be changed to joy when He returns and transforms our bodies to make them fit for eternity. All depends on our possessing Christ.

A WORD: The Old Testament reading gives us an ancient example of shooting the messenger. Jeremiah has warned the people of Jerusalem that God will judge them for their sins, and they say in reply, "You must die." The same thing happens in our Gospel lesson. Jesus weeps over Jerusalem because the people of that city kill God's prophets and stone the messengers God sends to them. Instead of resisting God's call, how much better it is to repent and be saved. Then Christ will gather us under his wings to care for us and keep us safe.

The epistle reading shows us how we are to live, not with minds fixed on earth, but with a mind that looks to heaven. We are waiting for a savior from there, Jesus Christ, and the gift he will bring at his return is worth far more than anything on earth, eternal life.
