Lent has begun. And Sunday is coming!

This first Sunday in Lent, we hear (again) of the temptation of Jesus.

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread." Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone.'" - Luke 4: 1-13

The devil lays a bet that Jesus will jump at the chance for glory, fame, and the quick fix. Who wouldn't? But Jesus keeps up the pithy one-liners long enough that the Tempter just has to slink away.

What are the temptations that catch your ear, singing out promises that your life should be more special than it is? Do you find yourself hungry for things that you believe will bring satisfaction? While we are waiting for something "spectacular" to happen (stones into bread, a million likes on social media, angels swooping down to catch us), we might just miss the real inbreaking in real time.

Rarely is life so spectacular. More often it is ordinary. What if we could see our own wonderings and wanderings and struggles with the incessant temptations to "greatness" as portals to an everyday spirituality? What if ordinary life can be holy? What if it already is?

This ordinary life is Good Enough. For faith. For transformation. For holiness.



UMCOR Statement on Conflict in Ukraine

The General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church is deeply troubled by the conflict between Russia and Ukraine and the ominous implications it has for escalating tensions between Russia and Western nations. We join many Christian leaders and organizations worldwide in deploring the Russian invasion of Ukraine on February 24, and we ardently pray for a redirection of military action toward diplomatic measures to resolve grievances. United Methodists are people of peace.

The United Methodist Church has mission-founded congregations in both Ukraine and Russia, some from the pre-Soviet period and others dating from post-Soviet years. Both countries are geographically within the Eurasia Episcopal Area and relate to the United Methodist central conferences of Europe. Bishop Eduard Khegay, the resident episcopal leader in Eurasia, is based in Moscow.

We join with Bishop Christian Alsted of the Nordic and Baltic Episcopal Area and chair of our denomination's Connectional Table in the prayer that conflict involving political matters will not break the unity between United Methodists in Ukraine and Russia.
