People were also bringing babies to Jesus for him to place his hands on them. When the disciples saw this, they rebuked them. But Jesus called the children to him and said, "Let the

little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." Luke 18:15-16

Lord Jesus, this Scripture ignites our hearts to pray for children impacted by the horror and trauma of this war—children both in the Ukraine and in Russia. Thank you for your passionate, compassionate heart for children.

We channel our deep sadness, growing rage, and sense of helplessness as fuel for our prayers. So, Jesus hear our laments, cries, and intercession for the most vulnerable ones. Our growing prayer list includes...

We pray for Russian children (and their moms) who have lost their fathers in this war, and haven't received the news yet. Have mercy, Lord. We ask for a mighty Gospel work among the Russian soldiers. Bring many to a saving knowledge of yourself, Jesus.

We pray physical protection and provision for Ukrainian children in harm's way. Supernaturally, and otherwise, minimize the suffering and loss of life, Jesus. Keep the bombs away, and food in their stomachs.

We pray for children who are seeing things no child's eye should ever see. Jesus, you are a great King and healer. By whatever means you chose—angels, loving parents, a direct work of the Holy Spirit, fellow believers... protect the hearts, minds, and imagination of children.

• The third part of repentance is that we cast ourselves on God's free, merciful, bountiful provision of grace (Verse 17).

The lavish enthusiasm of the father

The son "got up and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him." (Verse 20) God is not so busy with other things that he is not concerned about his alienated children. All his affairs are in order, and well taken care of. He is free to be concerned about his children.

"Before anyone else sees, God sees. He sees every twitch of your soul."
— John Piper

God's compassion is exceptional. The father is so full of joy that he drapes himself around his lost son's neck and welcomes him back with hugs and kisses of affection.¹

The celebration. Verse 23: "Bring the fattened calf, kill it, and let us eat and be merry."

The gospel is almost too good to be true. But what do you hear when the Father says (verse 24), "This son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found"? This parable is preeminently about God the Father, revealing his character as compassionate and forgiving. But God seeks a relationship that is consciously entered into by his children.²

Do we believe that God embraces those who turn to him? This text calls us to see that he does and then to rest in the encouragement that such love and grace generates.

Lost Sons and Lost Daughters Coming Home for Lent

Luke 15:11-24 (ESV)

And he said, "There was a man who had two sons. 12 And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' The Misery of Lostness

Running away from God and living without God starts by feeling free and ends in utter misery — either in this life or the one to come, or both.

You and I were made to be filled with God.

The nature of his repentance

• First, he comes to himself (verse 17).

When you are alienated from God, you are always alienated from yourself. You can't know yourself or relate properly to yourself if you are running from the one who made yourself for himself.

 The second part of repentance is humble brokenness and a deep sense of unworthiness before God (Verse 18).
