From our pastor

"How often I have wanted to gather your people just as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings." Luke 13:34

Having been told that Herod wants to kill him, Jesus compares Herod to a fox. Jesus shrugs off the threat and invites the people of Jerusalem to be gathered under his wing. This is not how most of us respond to the threat of bodily harm, is it? Our normal response is to protect ourselves. Whether its locks on our doors, hand sanitizer, a self-defense class, a home security system, or an N-95 mask, when threatened, we seek protection. Instead, Jesus gives us an image of God that we can hold onto when fear comes knocking on our door and bullies threaten to victimize us. *Jesus compares himself to a mother hen.* Hens gather their chicks and give them a place of warmth, tenderness, and belonging. On the one hand, it's a beautiful and comforting image. But we also know that foxes eat hens. In fact, a hen cannot stop a determined fox from harming them or their children. So what good is Jesus' promise to us vulnerable chicks in a world full of foxes? Maybe the antidote to fear isn't safety. What if it's love? Love doesn't prevent us from being harmed, but when we are embraced by divine love, then there really is nothing to be afraid of. In our lives, danger is not optional, but fear is, because the opposite of fear isn't bravery, it's love. Friends, in this world, there will be foxes, but amidst all the dangers you will ever face, God gathers you under her wing in warmth, tenderness, and belonging, both now and forever.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance - Ukraine

We are grateful for the outpouring of prayers and calls from congregations and individuals asking how they can help. As the violence continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling

churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority as PDA is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work.

We are hearing that the reformed churches in Ukraine and the region are also feeling called to join in the humanitarian response. PDA, therefore, anticipates that our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

As we pray for an end to this violence, we ask the U.S. Government and our European allies to make a commitment to the Ukrainian people for a peaceful solution. We don't know how long it will take, but we know that they will need help with the rebuilding of their country so that those who are fleeing now may one day return home safely.

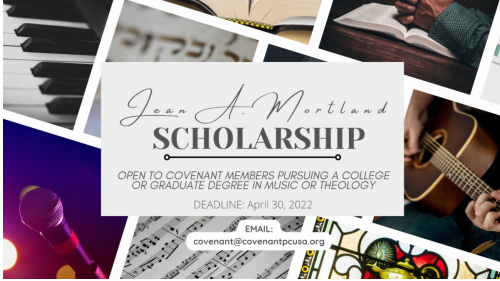

**The Jean A. Mortland
Memorial Scholarship**



The Jean A. Mortland Scholarship was established in 2007 in memory of Jean A. Mortland because of her appreciation for excellent music and advocacy for higher education. Jean was a member of Covenant for over 40 years and taught at Capital University Law School. Her faith was service oriented and socially active, and her leadership at Covenant was a gift of intellect, passion, and strength. She left a substantial bequest to us which was supplemented by donations made in her memory. Her

family wanted the fund to reflect her love of music, higher education, and the Christian faith. The recipient is selected by the Worship and Arts Commission. Applicants should be pursuing a college or graduate degree in music or theology, a member of Covenant or associated closely in some manner and demonstrate a commitment to excellence in their vocation. Also considered are overall GPA, financial need, and written recommendations. The candidate must be enrolled in the institution of higher learning to which the gift will be directed. Summer Preschool Camp (ages 3 – 5; 3 mornings a week)

Preschool Camp is for children ages 3 – 5 years old who have not yet attended Kindergarten. Preschool Camp meets Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings from 9:30 – 12:30, or 9:30 – 1:30. Each session lasts 2 weeks. Parents may sign up for as many as 4 sessions for a total of 8 weeks.

Preschool Camp activities engage children in playful learning experiences with as much outdoor time as possible. Each week the class explores a new theme such as camping, outer space, dinosaurs, building, or messy science depending upon the interests of the group and teachers. Once a week the class also participates in a cooking or food preparation activity.

Enrollment is limited to 12 children per 2-week session. Sessions begin June 6th and end August 5th. No camp during VBS week (6/20 – 6/24).

Camp Covenant (ages 5 – 9; 2 days a week)

Camp Covenant is for children entering grades 1 – 3 for the 2022 – 2023 school year. Campers attend 2 days a week (Tuesday and Thursday) from 8:30 am – 4:00 pm. Campers may sign up for individual weeks or for all 8 weeks.

On Tuesday campers take a deep dive into the topics with hands-on activities, discussions, short lessons and presentations, and arts and crafts. On Thursday campers continue exploration of the topics with a local field trip and a picnic lunch in the middle of the day.

Enrollment is limited to 12 children per week. Sessions begin June 7th and end August 4th. No camp during VBS week (6/20 – 6/24).

2022 – 2023 School Year Programs (ages 18 mos. – 11 years)

Currently enrolled families and church members have priority enrollment until March 1st. Programs include CDO for toddlers, Preschool, Pre-K, and After School (K-5).
