Just down the street from my parent's home near Canutillo, there are orchards full of pecan trees. Row after row after row of these beautifultall trees just seem to reach for the sky. Istand back in awe of those mammoth trees. Every year they seem to grow taller and wider. Are they having a contest to see who can reach the farthest into the sky? Do they compete to see who can have the most branches and the longest branches?

Down the street in another direction, a farmer is dedicating part of his land to growing a crop of pecan trees. Small little scrawny things that like look like twigs are carefully placed in the ground. Day after day we walk by. We see the field flooded but we don't see much growth. In time the trees begin to shoot up. They still look like twigs just taller with more girth. Occasionally there is a pecan plant that doesn't grow like the others. It is still alive. Thus far, the farmer hasn't removed those few young sapling-type plants. He just keeps working the ground and watering...



We live in a world where people often value themselves based on where they are on the ladder of life. Are they up the ladder further than they expected to go? Their life's work has netted their enormous success, a mammoth home, and a wonderfully talented family. While for others, things have gone totally in a different direction than they expected them to go. Did illness, financial setbacks, and family struggles create more challenges than one ever expected?

People can see themselves as big vivacious pecan trees deserving of the nutrients and water that is available, whereas others see themselves as a twig that hasn't grown to where it has expected to be. Most people are somewhere in between.

This kind of thinking can creep into our spiritual lives. If we have a lot of success in life, then we tend to say that God has blessed us. What about the people of faith who haven't had that great success? What about those who don't have outstanding talents? What about people who have a devastating disease? What about people who have a hard life? Do they say God has not blessed us? They may not say but they may feel it.
