

A Few Considerations

1. Each country, and states, have unique laws and constitutions. Although these documents are drafted with consideration to international human rights laws, it is your responsibility to do research on your own local country's laws, constitution, and limitations.
2. PMAs do not erase the pre-existing rights of others. They simply declare your right to do business in private, with other members of the same PMA.
3. PMAs do not erase the duties or obligations we have towards others and authorities. This includes the obligation to pay taxes where applicable.
4. In the U.S., clients request an EIN (a "business" identification number), from the IRS. This is a requirement for banking purposes only. To facilitate this process, we advise using the download version of the SS4 form only, and faxing it in to the IRS. This process is likely to be unique in each country. This is something you will need to research in your own country.
5. PMA Power Advisors offer a service that is limited to the education and preparation of founding documents only. Services such as tax preparation or legal representation fall outside of the scope of their service unless an Advisor is specifically qualified.
6. When you order your founding documents from a PMA Power Advisor, you are accepting membership of your Advisor's PMA, (together with its terms and conditions). In other words, they are walking the talk of conducting their private business with you in the privacy of their PMA. The scope of your membership in the Advisor's PMA will be limited to the processing of your ministry's founding documents only, unless your Advisor's PMA has additional provisions.
