DB's Dabblings: "INTERGENERATIONAL SOWING AND REAPING"

Last week during the Bible Class time I gave a general introduction to "Intergenerational Youth and Family Ministry" to a combined adult and teen class. If you didn't catch it, you may want to listen to it online. Maybe in defining intergenerational ministry, we are more familiar with the term "teamwork" because of our sports emphasis. Each team member must do their job, but they must work together as a team to achieve success. We saw that in our state champion high school football team in Stephenville. And it is not just the star players, everyone must do their part. The guards and tackles are just as important as the quarterback, running back and receivers. Defense is just as important as offense and special teams. But it goes way beyond that, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> stringers are as important to the team as first stringers, as is also the trainers, equipment managers, and the statistician. I enjoy March Madness college basketball, and through the years I have learned a couple of things about a successful bracket. And one is that there are a lot of teams that make it to the dance on individual talent, but most of the time the teams that make it to the Elite 8 are the teams that have learned to play together as a team. How does this apply to the church and sowing and reaping? Everyone has to do their part and they have to do what is best for the team.

In culture and history it has been described in different ways, but one approach is to use the terms – collectivism vs. individualism. The term "collectivism," refers to each individual part working together for the good and success of the whole. And the decisions that are made by the individuals in the group are made for the collective good of the whole. That's the principle that Moses is teaching in Deuteronomy, that the choices you make are going to impact the whole. That is the principle of the early church as the Body of Christ (Rom. 12; 1 Cor. 12; Eph. 4:11-16). What is good for the collective whole – not just my group, or my family, or my kid – but what is best for the whole church family? That includes the old and the young, new members and longstanding members, everyone! We will not all be doing the same individual tasks to produce fruit at the same time, but we will be doing our part – cultivating, sowing, watering, fertilizing, harvesting at the same time for the good of the whole church, the family of God.

**Ephesians 4:15-16** "Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work."






