

Living With a Wide-Open Heart

2 Corinthians 6:1-11 March 27, 2022

The Big Idea: We are called to have wide-open hearts toward the Lord and each other. After Paul reminds us that God makes us new creations through Christ, he gives a warning to make sure we don't let God's grace become an empty thing in our lives. This is a call to stay engaged in the spiritual battle of living for Jesus, using the "weapons of righteousness" that the Holy Spirit makes possible.

2 Corinthians 6:1-11 (ESV)

6 ¹Working together with him, then, we appeal to you <u>not to</u> <u>receive the grace of God</u> in vain. ² For he says,

"In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you."

Behold, <u>now is the favorable time</u>; behold, <u>now is the day of salvation</u>. ³ We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴ but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by **great endurance**, in **afflictions**, **hardships**, **calamities**, ⁵ **beatings**, **imprisonments**, **riots**, **labors**, **sleepless nights**, **hunger**; ⁶ by **purity**, **knowledge**, **patience**, **kindness**, the **Holy Spirit**, **genuine love**; ⁷ by **truthful speech**, and the **power of God**; **with the weapons of righteousness** for the right hand and for the left; ⁸ through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹ as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰ as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

¹¹ We have <u>spoken freely</u> to you, Corinthians; <u>our heart is wide</u> <u>open.</u>

6 Hard Questions I Need to Ask Myself:

- Am I simply going through the motions of knowing Christ? Is my relationship with Jesus empty and routine or vibrant, personal, and meaningful? [Matthew 15:8-9]
- Am I consciously living out my salvation or just relying on it in times of difficulty? [John 15:1-5]
- When people watch me in all the different circumstances of life, am I making God look good and appealing to them?
 [2 Corinthians 6:4; 1 Peter 4:11]
- Am I relying on weapons of righteousness to get through the hard times? [2 Corinthians 6:6-7]
- Do I faithfully choose to believe the truth of God's perspective on my life or do I adopt the lies of the world and the worst criticisms others may throw in my direction?
 [1 John 3:1; 1 Peter 2:9; Ephesians 2:10; 1 Corinthians 3:16; Psalm 139:14; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 2:19]
- Have I chosen to open my heart wide open toward people who have disappointed, criticized, and even attacked me?
 [2 Corinthians 6:11]
