First Lesson

Isaiah 55:1-9 (NRSV) Lector: Rae Smith

Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David. See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you.

Seek the LORD while he may be found, call upon him while he is near; let the wicked forsake their way, and the unrighteous their thoughts; let them return to the LORD, that he may have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.

Second Lesson

Luke 13:1-9 (NRSV) Rev. Katie Penick

At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. He asked them, 'Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them—do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did.'

Then he told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, "See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?" He replied, "Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig round it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."'



Praying with Ukraine for Peace & Safety



We join with Ukraine and the world in prayer for peace and safety in Ukraine. We ask that you join with us in praying for peace and safety for our Ukranian neighbors. Here are 7 suggestions to include in your prayers:

- 1. **Pray for the people in Ukraine:** Many foreign workers have left, but most nationals have not. Lift up the Ukrainians who can't uproot from their homeland and ask God to show mercy to them through turbulent times.
- 2. **Pray for the Refugees:** Over 3 million women and children have fled for safety during this time of war, pray for continued safety and a quick return to their homes. Pray that as they take refuge, their hosting nation finds the resources to help care for them and protect them.
- 3. **Pray for Peace:** Pray the promise of Psalm 46:9 back to God: "He makes wars cease to the ends of the earth. He breaks the bow and shatters the spear; he burns the shields with fire."
- 4. Pray that we all truly learn to Love One Another: None of us are superhuman and far too often our hearts turn inward instead of outwards to the world. Pray that our hearts all open in love to our neighbors—the kind of love described in 1 Corinthians 13. That means risk, sacrifice, heartache, and the uncomfortable decision to put others first.
- 5. **Pray for World Leaders:** Pray that God would give the leaders of the world a heart of love and wisdom to govern even in, especially in, difficult times such as these. Pray for Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky to find the strength and wisdom to persevere and lead his country.
- 6. **Pray for Support:** Pray that God would provide resources by stirring the hearts of believers to support our Ukrainian neighbors with housing for refugees, food, heat, gas, hygiene kits, crisis counseling and more. Pray and consider how you might help!
- 7. **Pray for Russia:** Pray that God will renew the heart of Russian President Putin to cease the attack on Ukraine. Pray for the Russian people that oppose the war but are forced to serve their country and for those who have spoken up and have been imprisoned for doing so.
