## From the Pastor's Desk

## The Preposterousness of the Resurrection

On his second missionary journey, Paul found himself in the city of Athens. Paul's spirit was provoked within him as he saw that the city was full of idols. So he started sharing the good news of the gospel. Paul's audience ridiculed him. They called him a "babbler." They accused him of preaching foreign gods. Why? Because he was preaching Jesus and the resurrection (see Acts 17:16-21).

Many of the Athenians could not agree with him. The idea that a dead person could come back to life was utterly preposterous to them. How could anyone believe that a dead person could come back to life again? That just doesn't happen.

But it did.

Jesus did rise from the dead.

He did defeat death.

And he now gives eternal life to anyone who believes that preposterous truth.

As a young man in the South African Air Force, I had been wrestling for months whether or not Jesus really did die and rise again. On Easter Sunday in 1976, I came to believe that Jesus really did die and come back to life again. My entire life changed. I have never been the same since.

I am a Christian because God saved me by his grace. He enabled me to believe that Jesus died and rose again—and he did so for me!

What is so preposterous to so many people now makes complete sense to me. And I pray that it does to you too!



## English as a Second Language (ESL) Update Karen Cross, Coordinator

#### From an ESL Level 1 Beginner Teacher:

At the beginning of every lesson, our students are encouraged to engage in an extemporaneous exchange. In one of these five-to-fifteen minute sessions we asked each student how they had learned some English prior to enrolling in our ESL class. Much to our surprise and delight we were informed by one student that she had been watching Barney, the big purple dinosaur, on television on the PBS channel. We all smiled and were amazed at the power of this children's programming to help in the acquisition of the English language for one of our adult foreign students.

There are so many wonderful things we learn from our ESL learners. They smile and seem to enjoy these opportunities for free expression even though at times it is in limited form, particularly for those in our beginners' class. This is, in our view, one way they can feel we genuinely care for them by showing interest and taking time to know them better. We long to see them come to Christ and through these conversations and devotional moments, set aside in every learning session, we hope that in time God touches their hearts and they come to faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### From an ESL Level 2 Beginner Teacher:

The multicultural classes give students and teachers alike the opportunity to see a true picture of God's love where people from all backgrounds and nationalities come together in friendship and understand that we are all in the same boat. In fact, it is good for me to remember that many of the students held higher positions in their home countries and are much more educated than I am! At the same time, prior education and profession does not play a role in this setting as the students are all equal here; finding themselves in the position of motivated students attempting to "start over" into a "new life."

Not only are they learning English, but are joined in a sense of common camaraderie as they end up becoming friends in spite of cultural or political differences which could, in a different setting, be dividing; but in this setting do not even come up! It is encouraging to see the students trying to help each other or explain things to each other. What a joy to see us all united in the quest for education and the betterment of life. Couple that with the spiritual element where each class ends with Bible verses, a devotional, and a prayer where the students take turns reading and commenting. There is no pressure from the teachers but simply an organic presentation of the gospel as it applies to daily life, which naturally is used as a springboard for English conversation practice and discussion. TBPC's ESL classes are a true picture of Jesus' ministry, where he met the physical and outward needs of the people while feeding their souls with the Gospel message! "

- **Hospitality Refreshment Team Members** needed one Sunday per month. Several areas of need are involved in this position: 1. Responsibility for preparing coffee at 10:00 a.m. for after church fellowship. 2. Serving coffee during the after church fellowship and clean up afterwards. Both positions would involve only one Sunday per month.
