He teaches Lutheran theology and mentors seminary students in a Bachelor of Divinity program at Riga Luther Academy. He assists in the re-accreditation of the English speaking seminary accredited through the European Union. Pray for John, Melinda and their children as they adjust to the language and culture in Latvia.
