

## From our pastor

*"Mary took an extraordinary amount, almost three-quarters of a pound, of very expensive perfume made of pure nard. She anointed Jesus' feet with it, then wiped his feet dry with her hair. The house was filled with the aroma of the perfume." John 12:3*

Mary boldly and without shame pours costly perfume on Jesus' feet and wipes his feet with her hair. I suspect this caused more than a little uproar. The feet are intimate, personal. For someone to touch your feet is not a mere pat on the back, or even an extended hug. Imagine someone doing this to you. How would you feel? My guess is that many of us would say, "Stop! This is out of line!" Why does Mary do this? This perfume cost a year's worth of wages. Mary's gift is lavish, brazen even, but for her, the cost is secondary. While everyone else in the room is dreaming about the revolution they think Jesus is going to bring in Jerusalem, Mary accepts the reality that he is going to die. Instead of denying it or wishing that hard truth away, she accepts it. Jesus' life will be poured out like sweet perfume, bringing death into the life of God. Because he did, we don't have to fear death or deny it. Instead, we learn to accept and even befriend it. Learning to accept death is one of the greatest gifts our faith can give us. Here's reality: our time here is limited. You will not always have your loved one here with you. That's what makes our time together so precious. Death comes for us all. No amount of exercise or dietary supplement or hair product can change that, and that's OK. It's a beautiful gift to entrust ourselves and those we love to God. As we enter Holy Week, I hope you'll come the harder services of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, before we rejoice together on Easter Sunday.

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION FOR ALL AGES!

Adult Forum Class - I hope you'll join us this Sunday at 9am in the Lounge to discuss Luke 22 and 23 - The Passion.

Children Christian Education - Children gather in the Multipurpose room (former administrative offices) at 9am before splitting into our classes. We sing, read, learn and dream together. Youth (6th-12th grades) meet in the chapel at 11am for snacks and discussion. There will be no Children Christian Education on Easter Sunday.

## DEACONS' MAUNDY THURSDAY OFFERING

The offering at the Maundy Thursday and Christmas Eve services supports the work of the deacons. The Board of Deacons is not funded through the church budget. It is through these offerings that the deacons serve our members and the community.

How does the Board of Deacons Serve? Deacons transport members to medical appointments through the C.A.R.E.S. ride program. Meals are prepared and delivered to those recuperating, celebrating births, and grieving. The deacons host memorial receptions. On May 15 our Super Seniors will be celebrated with a special luncheon and entertainment. Deacons are responsible for communion preparation. They also host the Red Cross Blood Drives. Emergency funding is available for members and those in the community.

Beyond our doors a monthly breakfast is prepared and served at Ronald McDonald House. Deacons take a meal and join in Fellowship with those at Hoge for HM3. We fight hunger through the Crop Walk, provide joy by organizing Adopt-A-Family at Christmas, and supply assistance to the Mid Ohio Workers Association. The deacons also extend support to the Mid Ohio Food Collective and COMPASS at Board Street Presbyterian Church.




## NEW 6-WEEK LENTEN STUDY

Thirty-six percent is used to alleviate hunger and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed. The remaining thirty-two percent invests in projects in economically poor communities around the world as they seek to develop solutions to their own challenges. ## Presbyterian Disaster Assistance - Ukraine

We are grateful for the outpouring of prayers and calls from congregations and individuals asking how they can help. As the violence continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling

churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority as PDA is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work.

We are hearing that the reformed churches in Ukraine and the region are also feeling called to join in the humanitarian response. PDA, therefore, anticipates that our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

As we pray for an end to this violence, we ask the U.S. Government and our European allies to make a commitment to the Ukrainian people for a peaceful solution. We don't know how long it will take, but we know that they will need help with the rebuilding of their country so that those who are fleeing now may one day return home safely.

## The Jean A. Mortland Memorial Scholarship

The Jean A. Mortland Scholarship was established in 2007 in memory of Jean A. Mortland because of her appreciation for excellent music and advocacy for higher education. Jean was a member of Covenant for over 40 years and taught at Capital University Law School. Her

faith was service oriented and socially active, and her leadership at Covenant was a gift of intellect, passion, and strength. She left a substantial bequest to us which was supplemented by donations made in her memory. Her family wanted the fund to reflect her love of music, higher education, and the Christian faith. The recipient is selected by the Worship and Arts Commission. Applicants should be pursuing a college or graduate degree in music or theology, a member of Covenant or associated closely in some manner and demonstrate a commitment to excellence in their vocation. Also considered are overall GPA, financial need, and written recommendations. The candidate must be enrolled in the institution of higher learning to which the gift will be directed.
