

DB's Dabblings: "Remember, Don't Forget"

In my childhood we lived in what we called, "out in the country." You would not use this description now as a designation for what is now part of suburban Little Rock, Arkansas. Back then it was heavily wooded and undeveloped, with gravel and dirt roads running through it. And one main road, or as we called it the blacktop road, Spring Hill, that was considered a sign that it led to somewhere more citified. And there was one little everything shop, Ayres' Store, about a mile from our house by gravel road where you could get some canned goods, lunch meat, milk, sodas (sorry Pepsi drinkers, in our household it was referred to as coke, no matter the brand), tobacco and candy. Every few weeks, Mom would send my brother and me on an errand to pick up something really important from the store, which was most likely because she was tired of hearing us agitating one another. It was a big adventure, we would usually get the red wagon and gather up soda bottles for refund money and get ready to pull it to the store. Mom would remind us to be careful on the last few hundred feet that we had to get out on the black top to reach our destination. She would always use the same language for this reminder, "Remember, don't forget." To which she would add, "and remember, don't forget to get the," fill in the blank with whatever she sent us after because we were notorious for getting sidetracked in the mudpuddles or rock throwing along the way, or so excited about spending our money on candy, that we would forget what we went after.

It is fascinating when you read through Deuteronomy, that Moses was a lot like my Mom. He often uses the words, "Remember, don't forget." And for basically the same reason, "Remember, don't forget the dangerous part of the promised land that will lead you away from God to begin worshiping idols." "In your excitement and joy of the promised land, remember, don't forget, to obey God's covenant laws in fulfilling your mission of showing love for God and your fellow man." But what did the Israelites do?
