Mirrion Memo ... Pray for Church Workers Around the World & in our Community

Dr. Martin and Marie Dicke are missionaries serving the Asia Region in Papua New Guinea. (They were supported by the Big Mission Event in 2016.) Dr. Dicke reported the six books that he edited last year for the church in Papua New Guinea have recently been printed by The Lutheran Heritage Foundation. These are in storage in Bangkok, Thailand awaiting shipment to PNG. He is also helping to coordinate two other large shipments to Lutheran schools and pastors, and lay leaders of the Gutnius Lutheran Church. Thousands of books include titles like A Statement of Faith, The Small Catechism, Jesus Never Fails pamphlets, A Simple Explanation of Christianity, 120 Bible Stories, My First Catechism and Activity books, New Testament Story Book for Kids, The Psalms and Gospels Book, Devotions for Teens by Teens, Enga Liturgy, Small Catechism in Tok Pisin, Jisas I No Save Fel pamphlets, A Child's Garden of Bible Stories in Tok Pisin, Small Catechism in English, and A Simple Explanation of Christianity and Bible Stories in Pictures. **Pray that these books arrive safely and that they are a blessing to the Papua New Guinea church and to all who receive them.**
