The leadership at Ferndale have agreed to try using this FaithLife service to help us as a body of believers maintain better communications. There are several pieces to their service that might be confusing at first.

All of these can be accessed via an app that installs on a cell phone or by any web browser on a computer. In order to see everything that a member would want to see, you must log into the account. The public can see only the items safe for the public to see. Members can see more. So you must have responded to your initial invite in order to see what you should see.

My Faithlife groups





You will automatically go to the site pictured above when you log in from faithlife.com. This is your personal page and you can customize it for yourself. To see the Ferndale Baptist Church group, you need to click on Groups/Ferndale Baptist Church as directed in the picture above. Think of the Ferndale Baptist Group as the communications portion of Faithlife.

Once in the Ferndale Baptist Church group you will see links to the right for the website and for the signups for church activities. It should look like this:

Logos Bible Study Software

It helps to understand this as the basis for everything Bible on Faithlife. If you chose Bible Reading Plans, it is actually using Logos Bible software. Most of the links to Logos are designed to get you to subscribe to their product. But you can use it without prescribing. Just use the link on the sidebar in the Ferndale Baptist Church group (see below) and it should open to a usable product. It is free so it does not use most of the popular versions of the Bible. That is their way to get you to subscribe. It is exceedingly good software.
