




From our pastor

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." Jesus answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out." Luke 19:39-40

Hearing the praise the disciples heaped on Jesus on Palm Sunday made some of the Pharisees uncomfortable. They urge him to silence them. Jesus responds that if they stayed silent, the stones would cry out. This made me wonder, what would the stones say to us if we could hear them speak? Last October, our family visited Zion National Park in Utah. As I walked through Zion Canyon, I was in awe of the giant and powerful rocks. They looked immovable, and yet over time these immense rocks were cut by a small, persistent river. What looks more powerful to you, the rocks or the water? If we could hear the rocks, they would say to us that water is more powerful than you think. Give water time and it cuts through the impenetrable. That's what the grace of God does. It doesn't look like much. It comes to us on a humble colt. It washes our feet and serves us a meal. It appears to be snuffed out by an unstoppable power, yet 2000 years later, the Roman Empire has long since fallen while the grace of God endures. Grace always rises again. This is the good news, that in our world of giant rocks, grace still abounds. It's full to the brim. We are the rocks, and God is the grace, patiently speaking a word of forgiveness to smooth our edges and create something beautiful. It's clear to me that God is creating something beautiful here at Covenant. This Holy Week, I hope

you'll join us for worship on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday at 7pm, and of course Easter Sunday at 10am as we celebrate God's persistent grace. After all, this is the first Holy Week Covenant has had in person for three years. Come home, and receive the grace of God once more.



DEACONS' MAUNDY THURSDAY OFFERING

The offering at the Maundy Thursday and Christmas Eve services supports the work of the deacons. The Board of Deacons is not funded through the church budget. It is through these offerings that the deacons serve our members and the community.

How does the Board of Deacons Serve? Deacons transport members to medical appointments through the C.A.R.E.S. ride program. Meals are prepared and delivered to those recuperating, celebrating births, and grieving. The deacons host memorial receptions. On May 15 our Super Seniors will be celebrated with a

special luncheon and entertainment. Deacons are responsible for communion preparation. They also host the Red Cross Blood Drives. Emergency funding is available for members and those in the community.

Beyond our doors a monthly breakfast is prepared and served at Ronald McDonald House. Deacons take a meal and join in Fellowship with those at Hoge for HM3. We fight hunger through the Crop Walk, provide joy by organizing Adopt-A-Family at Christmas, and supply assistance to the Mid Ohio Workers Association. The deacons also extend support to the Mid Ohio Food Collective and COMPASS at Board Street Presbyterian Church.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance - Ukraine

We are grateful for the outpouring of prayers and calls from congregations and individuals asking how they can help. As the violence continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling

churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority as PDA is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work.

We are hearing that the reformed churches in Ukraine and the region are also feeling called to join in the humanitarian response. PDA, therefore, anticipates that our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

As we pray for an end to this violence, we ask the U.S. Government and our European allies to make a commitment to the Ukrainian people for a peaceful solution. We don't know how long it will take, but we know that they will need help with the rebuilding of their country so that those who are fleeing now may one day return home safely.

The Jean A. Mortland Memorial Scholarship



The Jean A. Mortland Scholarship was established in 2007 in memory of Jean A. Mortland because of her appreciation for excellent music and advocacy for higher education. Jean was a member of Covenant for over 40 years and taught at Capital University Law School. Her faith was service oriented and socially active, and her leadership at Covenant was a gift of intellect, passion, and strength. She left a substantial bequest to us which was

supplemented by donations made in her memory. Her family wanted the fund to reflect her love of music, higher education, and the Christian faith. The recipient is selected by the Worship and Arts Commission. Applicants should be pursuing a college or graduate degree in music or theology, a member of Covenant or associated closely in some manner and demonstrate a commitment to excellence in their vocation. Also considered are overall GPA, financial need, and written recommendations. The candidate must be enrolled in the institution of higher learning to which the gift will be directed. Hoge Presbyterian Church offers the HM3 program every Saturday for its community in Franklinton including Music, Message, and a Meal. Area churches assist with the Meal, and Covenant creates and

serves a hot, home-made meal every 3rd Saturday. At this point in the pandemic, the wearing of masks is optional for both servers and guests.

Current attendance at HM3 leads us to bring enough for 50 meals.

·Usually, Covenant members cook in their own homes and then bring the food to Hoge to serve from the Hoge Kitchen. In April, the SOS Food Pantry team is cooking in the Covenant Kitchen as a team activity and

then bringing the food to Hoge!
