DB's Dabblings: "The God of Empathy"

In our Wednesday night class on the names of God last week we studied "The God of Empathy." We started in Exodus 2:23-25 "During that long period, the king of Egypt died. The Israelites groaned in their slavery and cried out, and their cry for help because of their slavery went up to God. God heard their groaning and he remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac and with Jacob. So, God looked on the Israelites and was concerned about them (NIV 2011)." There are some key words describing God's reaction to the cry for help of the Israelites: heard, remembered, looked, concerned. These words show empathy, feeling what others are feeling. In the ESV the words are: "And God heard their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob. God saw the people of Israel—and God knew."

Hearing and seeing are obviously part of the empathy process, and remembering the covenant relationship is vital to the history of the relationship, but what really illustrates the concept of empathy are the words "concerned" (NIV) and "knew" (ESV) translating the Hebrew word, **yada**, which can speak in the Old Testament of the most intimate of relationships, for example with Adam and Eve in Gen. 4:1. In fact Satan, as the Serpent in the garden, uses the word to convince Eve that God is trying to cheat her from the great prize that God wants to keep for Himself, for in God's intimate "knowledge" He "knows" that when she eats the forbidden fruit her eyes will be opened to become like God "knowing" good and evil. The truth is, God knows what is best for mankind and that the "knowledge by experience" of good and evil will be a burden He does not wish them to live with for eternity! God's relationship with mankind from that day forward is God showing his concern for His people burdened with pain and suffering by offering an opportunity for them to experience his compassion, grace, and mercy through the love he is extending for them to choose a relationship with Him through Christ. And through the resurrection, experience life without pain, suffering and death forever.

That's why we so often see God described with words like these:

**Psalm 103:8-12** The LORD is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love. He will not always accuse, nor will he harbor his anger forever; he does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us. (NIV2011)






