From our pastor

"Very early in the morning on the first day of the week, the women went to the tomb." Luke 24:1

Resurrection always begins in the dark. All four Gospels agree on this. I get up early most mornings, and it doesn't matter what time of year it is, it's always still dark out. This literal truth of our physical world points to a deeper spiritual reality, that new beginnings start in the dark. That was true on the first pages of the Bible that God creates light out of darkness. It was true on Easter, and it's true in our lives. When we describe dark times in our lives, we usually refer to sadness and grief. These brave women who go to Jesus' tomb have just endured a trauma we'd wish upon no one. They witnessed the person they'd placed their hopes and dreams upon be executed by the state. Surely, they were in shock and in the early stages of Post-Traumatic Stress disorder. Yet in the darkness of their grief, they somehow managed to put one foot in front of the other and go to tomb to honor their beloved teacher. Showing up for others when we are suffering is an act of courageous love, and courageous love is where resurrection begins. Resurrection isn't not merely an event that took place 2000 years ago. It's available to you today. The good news is that the night does not last forever. An expansive life courageously puts one foot in front of the other, through the darkness until the dawn breaks. Sikh activist Valarie Kaur said, "What if this darkness is not the darkness of the tomb, but the darkness of the womb?" On Easter, we see these are one in the same. Darkness is just the beginning. Neither death nor trauma will get the last word. A new day is at hand, a new story can be told, because Christ is risen. He is risen indeed, Alleluia!



Presbyterian Disaster Assistance - Ukraine

We are grateful for the outpouring of prayers and calls from congregations and individuals asking how they can help. As the violence continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling

churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority as PDA is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work.

We are hearing that the reformed churches in Ukraine and the region are also feeling called to join in the humanitarian response. PDA, therefore, anticipates that our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

As we pray for an end to this violence, we ask the U.S. Government and our European allies to make a commitment to the Ukrainian people for a peaceful solution. We don't know how long it will take, but we know that they will need help with the rebuilding of their country so that those who are fleeing now may one day return home safely.

The Jean A. Mortland Memorial Scholarship

The Jean A. Mortland Scholarship was established in 2007 in memory of Jean A. Mortland because of her appreciation for excellent music and advocacy for higher education. Jean was a member of Covenant for over 40 years and taught at Capital University Law School. Her

faith was service oriented and socially active, and her leadership at Covenant was a gift of intellect, passion, and strength. She left a substantial bequest to us which was supplemented by donations made in her memory. Her family wanted the fund to reflect her love of music, higher education, and the Christian faith. The recipient is selected by the Worship and Arts Commission. Applicants should be pursuing a college or graduate degree in music or theology, a member of Covenant or associated closely in some manner and demonstrate a commitment to excellence in their vocation. Also considered are overall GPA, financial need, and written recommendations. The candidate must be enrolled in the institution of higher learning to which the gift will be directed. HM3 UPDATE – HOGE'S, MUSIC, MESSAGE, MEAL

THANKS to Mark Owen (leading volunteers from the SOS Food Pantry volunteer team), Paster Joel, and his son Asher for working Saturday, April 16 (the day before Easter Sunday) to serve Sliced Ham and the fixings to the community of Hoge! Compliments were numerous, and the quantity was so abundant that attendees could take home leftovers. Thanks for gathering a multigenerational team to serve, as well!

Hoge Presbyterian Church offers the HM3 program every Saturday for its community in Franklinton including Music, Message, and a Meal. Area churches assist with the Meal, and Covenant creates and serves a hot, home-made meal every 3rd Saturday. At this point in the pandemic, the wearing of masks is optional for both servers and guests.

Current attendance at HM3 leads us to bring enough for 50 meals.

'Usually, Covenant members cook in their own homes and then bring the food to Hoge to serve from the

Hoge Kitchen. For example, in April, the SOS Food Pantry team prepared part of the meal in the Covenant Kitchen as a team activity and then brought the food to Hoge.

Chefs: Your expenses incurred in cooking may be reimbursed through our Financial Administrator, Ingrid Smith.
