RETURN TO CHAD

Jim Narvesen, my son Jonah, my friend Oumarou, and I pulled into Pastor Abel Nissoh's house in Bokoro late in the afternoon after traveling over six hours from Boudamasa. That morning we had visited Gethsemane de Meube, the school that was created in partnership between LBIM and the Chadian LB church. The last time I had been in Boudamasa over four years ago, the school wasn't there, and Nathanael and Carrie were still breaking ground in the community without Chadian missionary partners. This time we didn't see the Szobodys because they were on home assignment, but we enjoyed visiting their team, including the teachers at the school and partner missionaries Amine Alifa and Talitha.

Before that we had been with Dave and Sonja Narvesen (Jim is Dave's dad), who recently returned to Doh from their home assignment. They rejoined longtime Chadian missionary partners Eloi Malloum and Rachel along with more recent arrivals Jean Alona and Jacqueline.



As we arrived at the home of Abel and Louise, we were also greeted by other faces that we had met only a few days before in Ndjamena. Daniel, Nancy and their three kids had taken the bus out to join us for a few days in Bokoro. Originally from Taiwan, they have joined our LBIM team in Chad, sent and supported by the Taiwan LB church. They are in the process of getting a house built in Bokoro to join the team there. In addition, we met Anatole, one of two Chadian LB evangelists who have done outreach training and are also in the process of relocating to Bokoro. Their main purpose is to work with College Marcos school, a junior high/high school, with a focus on sharing the gospel with students.

On Sunday we worshipped with the LB congregation in Bokoro. Represented in the congregation are at least 5 or 6 different ethnic groups, each with their own language, so worship is in the common language of French. None of them come from the local area originally. They have come from southern Chad, mostly for employment in government positions, and often for only a couple years. They are not in Bokoro primarily for mission work, but as they spend time with those who are, my prayer is that they will be moved to get involved, and to take that involvement with them to their next work assignment.

And that exposure to mission will likely increase. Just as the mission team has expanded in Boudamasa and the area around Doh, now it is expanding in Bokoro. The team that has been one or two families in the past (including ours for a short time) is now looking at becoming several families representing multiple cultures from across Chad and the world. Communicating the gospel cross-culturally has its challenges, and an ethnically diverse team adds to the complexity. But the mission of the gospel is a cross-cultural mission, and this multi-cultured team in Bokoro represents that. We look forward to seeing what God does through it.
