HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *O Sons and Daughters of the King.* This hymn takes us back to Easter morning, the morning of Jesus' resurrection. The good news is first announced by the angels, "Today, the grave has lost its sting!" The word is shared with Thomas, who doubts the reality of the resurrection (stanza 5). Jesus takes away Thomas' doubt by inviting him to touch his hands and his sides (stanza 6). Where do we find ourselves? In the words of verse 8, "How blest are they who have not seen, and yet whose faith has constant been, for they eternal life shall win." We must not doubt the Lord as Thomas did, but trust the news shared by the angels, the resurrection witnessed by the apostles, and the blessing pronounced by our Lord. Those who have not seen yet have believed have won eternal life.

A WORD: The first reading (from Acts 5) shows us how the ministry of Jesus continued after his resurrection. Though Christ was bodily absent, he empowered the apostles to continue his work and released them when they were imprisoned. Our Savior continues to empower and care for his church today. We meet doubting Thomas in the Gospel. He believed when he saw. We have believed but not seen. Therefore, Jesus' blessing belongs to you and me.

The epistle reading is from Revelation. This is the only place in the Bible where Jesus is described to us in all his heavenly glory. This Lord of infinite glory and might rules all things for the glory of God and the salvation of his people.

BIBLE READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY: Acts 9:1-22 Revelation 5:1-14

John 21:1-19

ABOUT THE BULLETIN COVER: The women expect to find an imposing stone keeping them from the body of Jesus. Instead, they find the stone rolled away. In the short term, our gift has provided food, medicine, travel accommodations, documents, and clothes to refugees. A long-term fund is also being built that will be used to construct an LCMS mercy center in Romania for women and children and for the rebuilding of Lutheran churches in Ukraine following the war.
