#### **Easter Season Continues**

Today is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter. It is also known as Thomas Sunday. Hymn 255 in our pew hymnbooks, "O Sons and Daughters, Let Us Sing", includes as the last four verses the encounter of Thomas with the risen Christ. The emphasis of this story should not be Thomas' doubt (and ours), but on the graciousness of Christ for all believers. Note that Hymn 235 has the same title as 255. The music is the same, but the hymn 235 words are appropriate to last Sunday, Easter or Resurrection Day.
