

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name





The Flowering of the Cross

One of the great Easter traditions practiced by many Protestant churches (Reformed, Episcopal, Lutheran...) is the flowering of the cross. This tradition begins with a bare wooden cross, dotted with pin holes, covered with chicken wire or strung with vines that is placed in the church or on the church lawn. Then at a designated time on either Holy Saturday or Easter Morning, the process of decorating the entire cross with fresh colorful flowers begins, usually an assortment of lilies, daisies, tulips, and carnations are used but any spring flower will work. In many churches, members of the congregation bring flowers or greenery from home to place on the cross Easter morning during their worship service. Other churches prepare the cross Saturday evening with flowers purchased by the church and gather around the already decorated cross Sunday morning.

What's behind this? Is it just a pretty decoration? Well, it does look beautiful but there are also some beautiful traditions and meanings associated with the flowering of the cross.

The flowering of the cross represents the transition from Good Friday to Easter, from meditation on Jesus' death to joyful celebration of his resurrection. The ceremony transforms a barren cross, a reminder of Jesus' death, into an Easter symbol. Covered with fresh, living flowers, the cross serves not only as an emblem of Jesus' resurrection but also of the continuing presence of Christ among us today. In another variation of this ceremony worshipers cover the cross with homemade butterflies, another symbol of new life.

The tradition of the flowering of the cross is believed to date back as far as the 6th-century based on artwork from this era depicting a flowering cross. As with any long-standing tradition, there are many legends associated with the flowering of the cross that may or may not be true. You'll have to decide for yourself.

The tree of life in the Garden of Eden has often been seen as a prefiguring of the cross. Some legends even say that the wood of Christ's cross came from the tree of life or from a tree that grew from seeds of the tree of life. Another legend says at Christ's death the cross burst into blooming flowers. Either way, the flowering of the cross reminds us that Christ is the new tree of life and every cross now flowers with new life. Death has been defeated and Christ is risen. Alleluia!
