From our pastor

"You didn't choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you could go and produce fruit and so that your fruit could last." John 15:16

On Sunday, we were blessed to Confirm four young people and baptize one of them. It was a joyous celebration! Confirmation is our way of allowing those who were baptized as small children to finally speak for themselves. Some churches delay baptism until children are older, but Presbyterians allow small children to be baptized as a way of affirming that long before we choose God. God has already chosen us. This is what grace means: God names us as beloved even before we express our faith in God. When we confirm young people, they are given the opportunity to say yes to God's yes to them. Our confirmation program consisted of 12 weeks of classes on the Christian faith. The final project was for each Confirmand to write their own statement of faith, knowing that their faith will change over time. What follows are excerpts from each statement. Adrienne Wise writes, "I believe in God. I believe in a God that created all life. A God that created oceans, mountains, stars, my dog, and my best friends. A God who is warm and is open and forgives everyone. A God where every single person is worthy of His love." Kate Dougherty writes, "I believe that God's love is limitless and that we are all God's children. I believe that Jesus Christ is God's son who inhabited the earth and suffered for us. Jesus's suffering was to free us of our sins and to prove God's endless love." Matthew Lederer writes, "The Bible says that if you live by God's teaching you may go to heaven and live comfortably in the afterlife, but his teachings aren't just preparing you for an afterlife, they're leading you to a happy fulfilling life on earth also, so for me, regardless of whether I can prove or disprove whether God is real or not, if I choose to live by God's teachings and devoting myself to live as a Christian I will go through life with iov and hopefully spreading that joy to other people." Ethan Coakley writes, "In the beginning of the class my goal was to not disappoint my peers, but after the class has ended and thinking about it I realized this is something that I want to believe... Everything I want to say can be said in this word 'Yes'. Yes, I want to follow the will of Christ and spread love. Yes, I want to devote myself to the church's teachings. Yes, to it all and my Lord and Savior is Jesus Christ." What a gift to have such thoughtful and devoted young people at Covenant! May we continue to be a safe place for all people to explore guestions of faith and discover the unchangeable grace of God. Toward that end, I hope you'll attend the Becoming a Welcoming and Inclusive Church workshop this Saturday from 10am-1:30pm and Sunday worship. There is room for you at the table! 
'Becoming an Inclusive Church' – Brian Ellison Will Visit Covenant, April 30-May 1

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance - Ukraine


We are grateful for the outpouring of prayers and calls from congregations and individuals asking how they can help. As the violence continues, the number of people being displaced internally and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling

churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority as PDA is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work.

We are hearing that the reformed churches in Ukraine and the region are also feeling called to join in the humanitarian response. PDA, therefore, anticipates that our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

As we pray for an end to this violence, we ask the U.S. Government and our European allies to make a commitment to the Ukrainian people for a peaceful solution. We don't know how long it will take, but we know that they will need help with the rebuilding of their country so that those who are fleeing now may one day return home safely.

The Jean A. Mortland Memorial Scholarship

The Jean A. Mortland Scholarship was established in 2007 in memory of Jean A. Mortland because of her appreciation for excellent music and advocacy for higher education. Jean was a member of Covenant for over 40 years and taught at Capital University Law School. Her

faith was service oriented and socially active, and her leadership at Covenant was a gift of intellect, passion, and strength. She left a substantial bequest to us which was supplemented by donations made in her memory. Her family wanted the fund to reflect her love of music, higher education, and the Christian faith. The recipient is selected by the Worship and Arts Commission. Applicants should be pursuing a college or graduate degree in music or theology, a member of Covenant or associated closely in some manner and demonstrate a commitment to excellence in their vocation. Also considered are overall GPA, financial need, and written recommendations. The candidate must be enrolled in the institution of higher learning to which the gift will be directed. Opportunity to Serve by Providing Lunch through the OPEN SHELTER

Do you want to do hands-on mission once a month or occasionally? We would love to welcome new people to the Open Shelter Lunch Making Team!

Covenant helps out people in need (including the homeless) served by the Open Shelter by providing 175 sack lunches on the **second Friday of every month**. We are revising the menu and process, and we need more volunteers to help out! Here are ways to join in:

- Anytime, you could drop off your clean take-out containers (reusable disposable food containers) to
 counter under the windows of Covenant's kitchen. We take them to the Open Shelter to help people
 take home leftovers from donated restaurant meals. When these meals are donated, people are
 encouraged to take sack lunches with them to-go as well.
- You could help with supplies for the sack lunches; we would let you know the quantity, and you'd
 deliver them to Covenant's kitchen by the Thursday before the delivery day (church closes at 4pm) or
 by the second Friday of the month at 8:15, when we assemble the sack lunches. The costs for these
 supplies may be reimbursed by submitting your receipts to our Financial Administrator, Ingrid
 Brooker. Ways to help include:
 - You could shop for supplies (like paper bags and napkins from GFS, drinks, plastic bags, sandwich makings, bananas...)
 - You could make 45 or 90 bags of unsalted nuts at your home.
 - You could make 45 or 90 bags of baby carrots at your home.

- You could help make 160 ham and cheese sandwiches with the team at Covenant's kitchen, and then
 assemble the lunches into paper bags and pack them in boxes and into a car (or two) between 8:15

HM3 UPDATE – HOGE'S, MUSIC, MESSAGE, MEAL

Hoge Presbyterian Church offers the HM3 program every Saturday for its community in Franklinton including Music, Message, and a Meal. Area churches assist with the Meal, and Covenant creates and serves a hot, home-made meal every 3rd Saturday. At this point in the pandemic, the wearing of masks is optional for both servers and guests.

Current attendance at HM3 leads us to bring enough for 50 meals.

- Usually, Covenant members cook in their own homes and then bring the food to Hoge to serve from the Hoge Kitchen. Alternatively, you can prepare the food as a group in the Covenant kitchen and carry it to Hoge. For example, in April, the SOS Food Pantry team prepared part of the meal in the Covenant Kitchen as a team activity and then brought the food to Hoge.
- Groups have signed up to serve in the months throughout the year of 2022... THANK YOU! Group leaders: If your group is lacking servers or chefs, let Cathy know; she has contacts for volunteers who can join your team. Chefs: Your expenses incurred in cooking may be reimbursed through our Financial Administrator, Ingrid Smith.
- Cathy Levy will gather an ad-hoc group to serve on November 19; please let her know if you'd like to
 join as a chef or a server for November.
- If you or your kids would like to help out as a chef (usually, in your own home) and/or server (from 4-7pm) during one of those 3rd Saturdays where a group already is signed up, go ahead and contact that groups' leader; we'll bet they would LOVE to include you on the team! You can find the leader's name on the website, or you can ask Cathy Levy, and she'll connect you up.
