For example, although they were called to be fishers of men, in today's Gospel, the disciples learned that they needed to listen to their Lord even when fishing for fish. Change for Peter would mean moving from regretting his past (where he denied his Lord) to feeding Christ's flock. And for Saul (Paul), Christ's eternal living presence would mean changing from catching Christians to proclaiming Christ before Gentiles and kings. The heavenly host in the reading from Revelation sing their eternal songs of praise to the Lamb on the throne. How might our risen Lord's eternal victory over sin and evil change us so that we echo their praises already here in time? (Creative Worship for the Lutheran Parish 2021 CPH)

## Mission Memo ... Pray for Church Workers Around the World & in our Community

Rev. Matthew and Kali Wood (Laurel, Eleanor, Caroline) are missionaries in South East Asia, in Medan, Indonesia. (The Big Mission Event supported them in 2018.) To go back into Indonesia they report to the immigration office, the police office, and obtain an Indonesian ID (called a NIK card). Then Matthew meets with the Hymnal Committee to go over the translations produced for the new hymnal. They are also eager to meet with the new LCMS family in Medan, the Nelsons who just arrived Feb. 9 and are language learning. Matthew is pursuing a doctor of philosophy degree. Kali is pregnant, so they will return to St. Louis on June 3. They expect to return to Indonesia in October, in time to get a birth certificate, a social security number, a passport to add their new baby to their visas. Pray that Matthew's PhD classes go well, that his mentoring pastors in education, and overseeing translation projects may be successful. Pray for the health of Kali and the new expectant child.
