- Do I need it?

Buying an 'ethical coffee - This month's <u>Ethical Consumer magazine</u> rates coffee brands and coffee shops according to a number of ethical criteria, and it's worth a quick 'scan read'. Fairtrade continues to be the best way to ensure that the coffee you buy is ethical, guaranteeing a fair price for farmers and helping them withstand the effects of climate change, and is the highest industry standard.



Count your plastic for one week 16th-22nd May

We all do our bit to recycle, but somehow plastic is everywhere! The amount of plastic produced around the world is even set to double in the next 20 years.

Recycling alone isn't going to solve this problem as big companies are producing too much in the first place and our recycling systems can't cope. **The Big Plastic Count** is an initiative to gather evidence, because right now, nobody really knows how much plastic we're throwing away or what happens to it once it leaves our homes. The results of the count will enable campaigners to demand some big changes from the government, big brands and supermarkets.

No Mow May

Let your grass grow a little longer this month as this can boost lawn flower production by as much as 2.5 times and allows grass to develop flower heads, which will attract bees. The longer grass will also improve moisture retention, which is beneficial to both the grass and the bees. And avoid any chemicals, pesticides and weed killers. And if you must have a neat lawn, consider leaving a dedicated area as a habitat to attract bees.

Grow bee-friendly flowers

Bees are dying - and we rely on bees to pollinate a third of all the food we eat, so we need to save them! Look out for special deals on wildflower seeds at the moment. For example <u>Just Bee Honey</u> are offering one free pack of a special mix of bee-friendly seeds with every order of honey, or 99p per pack plus postage. The seeds will flower from June until end of September.
