Easter Season Continues

Today is the 3rd Sunday of Easter. Your Worship Committee study book suggests that it can be called "Meal Sunday", because there are several references in the Gospels to the risen Jesus revealing himself by sharing a meal with his disciples. Lectionary Year C suggests the Gospel reading for this Sunday is about Jesus preparing a meal for his disciples by the Sea of Tiberius a few days after his resurrection (John 21:1-19). The Year A reading has Jesus revealing himself to two men at a meal at an Inn on the road to Emmaus on Resurrection Day (Luke 24:13-35). The Year B reading has Jesus revealing himself to most of the disciples that same day while they were eating a meal (Luke 24:36b-48).
