The Ascension of Jesus

Forty days after Jesus' resurrection, he ascended into heaven. The commemoration of Jesus' ascension into heaven always falls on a Thursday, and this year it will be on May 26, 2022.

The ascension of Jesus is described for us in Luke 24:50-53: "Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God."

We don't often think of Jesus' ascension. And we don't often realize the implications of Jesus' ascension. In his commentary on Luke's Gospel, John MacArthur mentions a number of implications that flow from the ascension of Jesus. Let me briefly mention a few of them.

First, the ascension of Jesus marked the completion of the work of salvation. Jesus had come to earth as a baby, lived until he was about thirty-three years old, died on a cross at Golgotha, was buried in a tomb, and was resurrected back to life again. Jesus' words on the cross signified that he had completed the work of salvation when he said, "It is finished!" (John 19:30). There is nothing to be added to what Jesus has done to save sinners. And his ascension is proof of that.

Second, the ascension of Jesus marked the end of his limitations. During his incarnation, Jesus "emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Philippians 2:7–8). After Jesus completed his work of salvation on earth, he ascended to heaven to be with his Father again, and to return to the glory he had before he left heaven. Nevertheless, as John Blanchard said, "When Jesus came to earth he did not cease to be God; when he returned to heaven he did not cease to be man." He returned to heaven as the God -Man, whom he will remain forever.

Third, the ascension of Jesus marked his exaltation and coronation. Jesus' ascension to heaven was the beginning of his post-incarnation reign. In fact, John Calvin put it this way, "Christ's ascension into heaven was the real commencement of his reign."

Fourth, the ascension of Jesus signaled the sending of the Holy Spirit. Earlier in his ministry, Jesus taught his disciples that "the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified" (John 7:39). On the night before his death, Jesus told his disciples, "Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you" (John 16:7). Of course, the Holy Spirit was sent ten days after the ascension of Jesus, on the Day of Pentecost.

Fifth, the ascension of Jesus marked the start of his preparing believers' heavenly home. On the night on which Jesus was betrayed, Jesus had the last divinely-sanctioned Passover meal with his disciples and also instituted the first divinely-sanctioned Lord's supper with his disciples. After the meal, Jesus had an extensive time of teaching with his disciples. Among the many things he said to his disciples, he said, "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:1–3).

And sixth, the ascension of Jesus marked the passing of the work of evangelism to his followers. Jesus' work is both finished and unfinished. It is finished in the sense that he has done everything necessary for our salvation, and nothing can be added to his finished work (cf. John 17:4; 19:30). But the work of evangelism is unfinished. Luke's second volume, *The Acts of the Apostles*, describes Jesus' work that was continued through his apostles, and the rest of the New Testament describes how Jesus' Church is to continue the work of evangelism until he returns.

There are many other implications that flow from Jesus' ascension, but these will suffice for now. Let us be encouraged by the ascension of Jesus.

Thanks so much for sharing with our kids on Saturday night for Global Kidz and on Sunday morning in our "Show Me Jesus!" Small Groups during our recent Missions Weekend! It was great to have you and Easie here to share your ministry, compassion, and vision in person. Besides, we love you!

Thanks for the picture of you and Esaie that you recently sent so they now have a mini-prayer poster in each of their SMJ! classrooms. There's one for their Global Kidz bulletin Board. Soon they will also have a laminated wallet-size, kid-size picture prayer card. I am praying that every one of our TBPC kids bonds with you as they pray for you, your ministry in Haïti, and the staff and 550+ kids at Christian Academy of Dociné.

I'm in the reminiscing phase of my life, so our efforts to help them bond with you reminds me of how my parents had us pray for the missionaries who were supported that our small church in South Jersey.

Our prayers were simple like, "Please bless the Oxleys in Japan." Little did I expect to meet one of their sons and his wife in my Young Adult Bible study group in Chicago in my early 30's. He had a degree in International Business Law from Wheaton College, and, as I remember, planned to head back to Japan.

We also prayed, "Please bless the DDH family in Pakistan." Little did I expect to meet one of their sons and his wife in Dallas three years ago when Sammy Dishman was baptized in Peter's home church there. Phil, one of the DDHs' sons, and his wife are serving with MTW in a different and undisclosed location that is closed to the Gospel and so risky that I can't even write their names.

We also prayed, "Please bless the Matlacks in Germany." Little did I expect to find their youngest son "Kenny" and his wife listed in the TBPC Directory when Freddy and I came to Tampa to candidate almost 20 years ago... Meanwhile, Ken and Tammie planted a PCA Church in Palm Harbor, and ministered in Germany with MTW where Ken became a Regional Director. For many years, they have served in an extremely significant role in training and encouraging MTW missionaries around the world in intercessory prayer. They are still supported by our prayers and financial contributions by you all as TBPC members!

I chuckle when I think that we were praying for MTW missionaries before they were even adults and 25 years before the PCA and MTW even existed. I would love for our TBPC kids to have the blessings of knowing that their prayers for our missionaries also keep getting answered for many years after they have prayed. I would also love for them to be extra excited to see the results in eternity. I'd love to be watching when they meet some from every tribe and tongue and nation, and discover waves of results in the believers they

will meet because they prayed for teachers and children of Christian Academy of Dociné.

May God bless you and your family, and all brothers and sisters in Christ in Haiti!


Currently, the Cafe consists of coffee and hot water; we are hoping to re-implement light food items at a future date, but for now that is on hold.

From an ESL Beginner Level 2 Teacher:

Even though Zoom teaching is far from ideal if it weren't for this medium three of our beginner level-2 students would not be able to participate. One of our students joins us from Poland, one from Brazil, and another from London and Houston. A fourth student lives locally but is unable to attend in person because of her health.

Another benefit of Zoom is when our class met in person, many students did not stay for the Bible Study portion of class. It is a blessing that attendance for the Bible Study is nearly 100 percent using Zoom.

From an ESL Intermediate Teacher:

Currently, we have two intermediate classes. Both classes have been on Zoom this year. The evening class will remain on Zoom next year as most students in that class work and would not have time to commute to class after work. The intermediate morning class will try to move to an in-person class next year. Both intermediate classes have a total of thirteen enrolled students. Our ideal class size is twelve students. The more students that are added to a class, the less time there is for individual student participation. It will be very difficult to admit more students to intermediate classes in the future. If there is an increased demand from new students asking to join intermediate level classes, we will need to start a new class, or add students to a waiting list.

There are a wide variety of home countries for our intermediate students: South Korea, Thailand, Venezuela, Puerto Rico, Ecuador, Morocco, China, India, Syria, Haiti, Bolivia, Egypt, Mexico, Poland, and Columbia. The student from Egypt is a family member of a local student that attends the Beginner Level 1 and 2 Classes. She attends class in the evening from Egypt. Our class meets from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. In Egypt, she is attending the class from 11:30 p.m. to 1:00 a.m.! Even though it is late for her, she remains in class for the Bible Study at the end of class.

Our intermediate students have such a wonderful rapport with each other. Recently, one of our students missed several weeks of class due to illness. I received text messages from fellow students and was able to pass along their messages to the student who was ill. He told me it meant a great deal to him that both the teachers and the students had been praying for him. We have almost 100 percent participation in our Bible Study in both intermediate classes.
