#### Mental Health First Aid Training



Did you know that 1 in 5 people live with a mental illness in the U.S. and that the average American idoes nothing to be proactive regarding their own mental health?

Faith communities provide a space for people to connect with others and to find and give support in trying times. More and more, faith communities are bringing Mental Health First Aid trainings to their churches to improve mental health, raise awareness and save lives. Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is a powerful tool in the hands of church members to serve their communities in a powerful way! MHFA teaches congregants how to spot the signs and symptoms of ill mental health and provide help on a first aid basis. It will not teach you to be a therapist, but just like physical first aid, it will teach you to listen, reassure and respond, even in a crisis. This is an important tool to aid us in serving our community better! The workshop is scheduled for **June 11<sup>th</sup> from 9am-4pm** at the church and is free to Zion participants. There is a \$25 fee for all others.
