

This morning, I'd like to explain a fun and simple exercise, but first, I want you to show me the exercise that you think I'm going to teach you. So...think about different exercises that you know and then think about which one you think I'm going to teach you. When I say

"Go" – I'll give you 10 seconds to show me the exercise you think I'll teach you. We'll see how close your guess is to my actual exercise. Any questions? Ok, I think we're ready to do this. Go ahead and stand up and have someone count to 10 for you while you show the exercise that you think I am going to show you. Ready? Set? Go!

10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1!

Yay! Well done! Thank you for doing that! That was great! I think your exercise moves are more fun than mine. The exercise I was going to show you was jogging in place. The way to do that is to stand in one spot. Then, you bring one knee up, nice and high. Then you bring it down while you bring the other knee up. Then you do it faster and faster until you're "running in place."


So, were you able to show others what I was going to teach you before I told you the move? No, not really... Do you think that if I had told/showed you FIRST, then you would've been better able to show others what my exercise move was? Yes, I think so too.

In today's scripture story, Jesus is teaching his disciples a new rule. He tells them to, "Love one another as I have loved you." A very important thing about this rule is that Jesus was already living that rule. He had already shown his disciples how to love one another because he had already been loving them. And, because Jesus loved first, then the disciples were able to see and know what Jesus meant when he said, "As I have loved you." Here are some of the loving actions that Jesus did for his disciples: 1) He invited them to be his students and wanted to spend time with them. 2) He shared stories with them to help them better understand God. 3) He showed them how to how to talk and listen to God (what we call praying).

And you know what?


