HYMN OF THE DAY: Our hymn of the day is *Borning Cry*. God speaks to us in this hymn, assuring us that just as he was with us when we were born, he will be with us when we die. He heard our first cry; he will hear our final breath. Along the way, God will guide us, seek us, encourage us. He will be there to receive our praise and answer our prayer. Right when it seems as though God could do no more, we find that he has another gift for us at the end of life, eternity with him in heaven.

A WORD: In our Gospel reading, Jesus encourages us to pray. The Father loves us because we love Christ and believe in Christ. So we have the privilege of prayer and the certainty of the Father's ear. In our reading from Acts, God directs Paul to carry the Gospel into Macedonia. God loves all people and has sent us into the world to bring his Gospel to those in need.

Our final reading from Revelation describes the new Jerusalem. We see its walls and gates. We walk beside the river of life and eat the fruit that brings healing to all people. Listen closely to this reading and let it fire your imagination. No eye has seen and no ear has heard what God has stored up for those who love him because it will be better than we could ever ask or imagine.
