

Prayer Station 1 – Written on Our Hearts

Prayerfully consider what it is that God has tattooed or impressed upon your heart as your mission, as the church's mission, to serve our region? Then ask yourself, what part of Jesus' vision am I gifted to pay based upon my gifts, simplicity, activities, spending, living patterns, etc--within my community, within my home, and within my church?

Then take a heart as a reminder of the gift God has placed in your heart. If worshiping virtually, draw a heart reminder for yourself and be sure to share your responses with us if you like.

Prayer Station 2 - Serving Our Community

Pray for the homeless, the hungry, the poor and the oppressed asking God to create within your heart a passion to serve our siblings in Christ. Prayerfully consider how you may bring the good news to these special children of God.

Fill a bag of goodies and keep with you as you run your errands so that you have something to give to the next homeless or hungry child of God that you meet. It will provide them a small treat and tell them about our church and our Tuesday's Supper and One-Stop Shop community outreach resources.

FROM THE OPEN & AFFIRMING TEAM

Zion Reformed ONA Core Team Formed!

At Zion's Annual Meeting in March, we voted as a congregation to begin the discernment journey to consider becoming an Open and Affirming congregation. Since that time we have established the ONA Core Team consisting of Burnie Clutz, Christine Coleman, Michael Jones, Calvin Livingston, David Ridenour, and Judy Thompson with Pastor Katie Penick serving as the team's Pastoral Advisor. They have now met 3 times as a team and are working hard to build a foundation to begin sharing with the congregation.

The ONA Core Team will help organize learning activities to better understand the ONA movement, our LGBTQIA+ siblings, and why it is important to be intentionally inclusive, but the decision to become an ONA congregation or not is entirely up to the congregation as a whole and not the Core Team or select individuals.

This discernment process will happen over many months to ensure we as a congregation have the information we need to make an informed decision so there is no need to worry about a hasty decision being made. There will be mission moments, workshop opportunities, 1:1 conversations availability and more over a period of time. Be sure to also watch for updates in the bulletin such as this and in the newsletter helping to provide tid-bits weekly and monthly to better understand the ONA movement.

The ONA Team wants to hear your voice and have heart to heart conversations with each of you. If you don't understand ths movement, our LGBTQIA+ siblings or any other aspect of this conversation, let the team know. We will talk it through together. We aren't experts but servants of Christ with a heart for welcome and inclusion so it may be that we learn something together!

What is Open & Affirming (ONA)?



The Open & Affirming Coalition of the UCC was founded in 1972 to help the United Church of Christ (UCC) reach each of its milestones on the journey towards acceptance and justice for its LGBTQIA+ and same-gender loving (SGL) members. The basic concept of the Open & Affirming movement is Romans 15:7, "Accept one another just as Christ accepted you in order to bring praise to God." (NIV)

From General Synod's first resolutions advocating for the civil rights of LGBTQIA+ citizens to the church's historic affirmation of marriage equality, the Coalition has been a spur to our beloved denomination's conscience. By claiming the right for all of God's children to participate fully in ministry and fellowship, by reminding UCC members of the injustices that continue to prevail in wider society, by providing leadership for the growing ONA movement, the Coalition has been an effective agent for change in the UCC.

In the 21st-century, the Coalition faces new challenges. With support of the Coalition more than 1700 congregations are now ONA making it the largest welcoming movement around. With such success and marriage equality now recognized nationally, the Coalition has begun reaching out to the nearly 3300 congregations that have not yet publicly affirmed their welcome to the LGBTQIA+ community. LGBTQIA+ youth still face the threat of bullying and suicide in communities across America. Transgender citizens are still denied basic civil rights. become ONA. Powerful and well-financed groups are mobilizing to enact new legislation to grant broad "religious exemptions" against discrimination in employment, housing, and public services.

With the support of congregations who join the ONA movement the Coalition is building a stronger movement of inclusion and justice in the UCC, and beyond. Will we be the next congregation within the UCC to offer an authentic and confident welcome to LGBTQIA+ seekers and their families?
